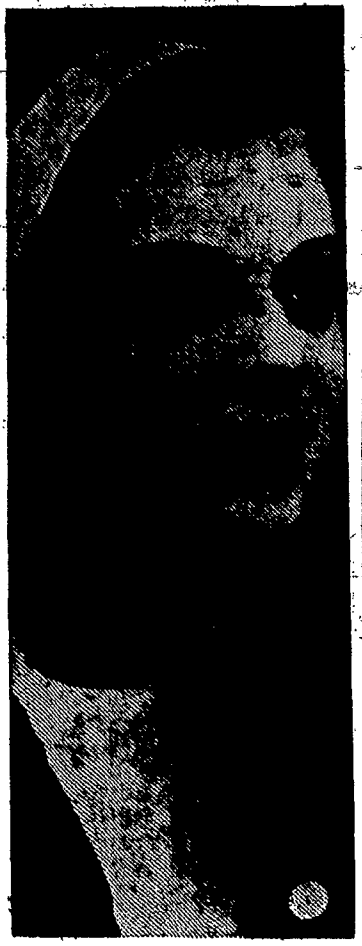

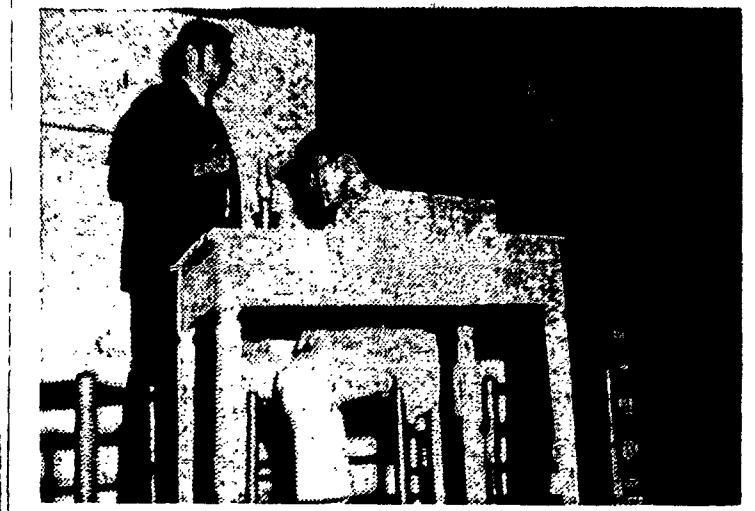
Seven public and parochial schools will be served by a proposed new library.
