St. Agnes juniors and seniors will date their fathers the following week, on April 29, again with the "King and I" theme.

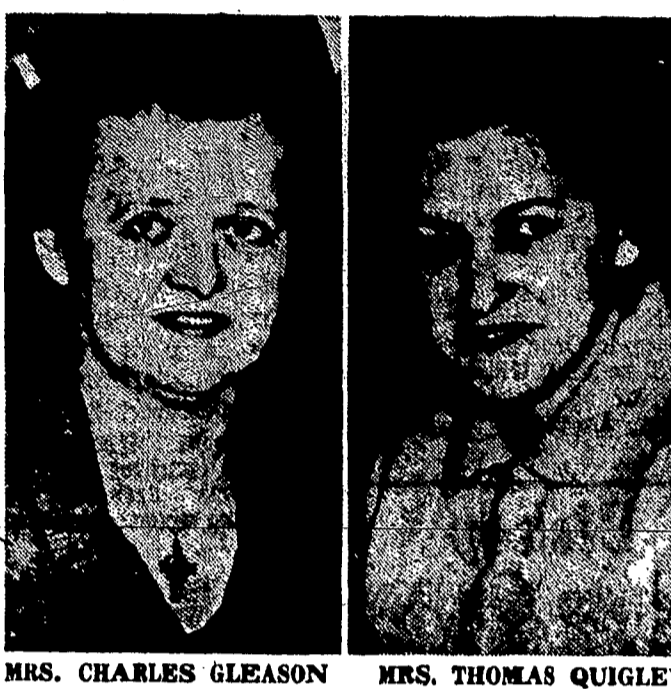
Board Head Sounds 'Realtor Week' Call

The awards were announced by Tri Beta, national biological honor society, under whose sponsorship the competition is held.

First place in the zoology division, which includes a cash award of \$50, was given to Miss Cahier for her paper on "The Nuclear Membrane (Karyotheca)". The article will be published in the May issue of BIOS, the Tri Beta journal which is published quarterly.

At the present time, Miss Doran is serving as president and Miss Cahier as vice-president of the Nazareth Chapter. From April 14 to 16, Miss Doran, Miss Cahier, and four other Nazareth students attended a regional meeting of Tri Beta at Hiram College in Pennsylvania.

The committee of judges awarded second place in the botany division and a check for \$25 to Miss Doran for her paper on "Mechanisms of Genetic Transfer and Recombination in Bacteria". Eta Omicron, the Nazareth College Chapter of Tri Beta, was organized at the college in 1958. Nazareth is one of about 130 colleges holding membership in the organization, which is devoted, as its name indicates, to the study of life, in the water, in the air, and on land. Participation is reserved for those students whose major interest is in biology, and who display superior ability in this field.
