## Philosopher Schonleber To Lecture

Dr. John E. Schonleber, a native Rochesterian and a lecturer in contemporary philosophy at Saint Michael's College in the University of Toronto, will address the Philosophy Club of Saint John Fisher College, on Wednesday, April 26, at 7:45 p.m. His topic will be "From Kierkegaard to Heidegger: A Lesson in Philosophic Wisdom."
