

Summer Institute Set At McQuaid Jesuit High

McQuaid Jesuit High School Summer Institute for high school students will be held from July 5 to 21. The institute, designed to stimulate students of superior initiative and ability who desire further knowledge in selected fields of chemistry and physics, has been made possible by Bausch & Lomb, Inc.

The purposes of the Institute are to provide students with an opportunity to add greater depth to their present knowledge, to gain first-hand information about scientific laboratory techniques, and to discuss with an expert staff new lines of scientific thought that will reveal some of the many research areas still to be pursued.

Seventy-two high school students will be chosen for the program, 36 in chemistry and a like number in physics. Both programs, each presuming a full year's study in the respective science, will extend far beyond the normal high school course, in content, experiments and equipment available for use in the laboratory, according to the school.

The Institute convenes each day, weekends excluded, at 8:45 a.m. and ends at 12 noon. A one hour lecture will be followed by a break and then a two hour laboratory period.

At the beginning of the program six lectures will be given in common to all participants. They will cover basic content matter that will be amplified and directed towards specific topics in Chemistry and Physics in the remaining lectures.

St. Columba Knights Head Visits Here

Francis J. Mildner of London, England, supreme knight of the Knights of St. Columba, a Great Britain; here to visit with an old friend, Dr. Hugo Kellner of Caledonia, was a visitor at Rochester Council, Knights of Columbus rooms, Monday.

The Knights of St. Columba, the supreme knight explained to Financial Secretary Orrin C. Ochs and Martin Cole, insurance representative is the counterpart of the K. of C. in Great Britain. The organization with some 500 councils was instituted shortly after World War I with the aid of the K. of C. Supreme Council in New Haven, Conn. Catholic men in Great Britain, the national leader recalled, were so impressed with the work of the Knights of Columbus overseas units that they wanted an organization similar. The Knights of St. Columba does not handle insurance but is a Catholic activity group in other ways like the American knights.

Fraternal greetings to the local knights was extended by Supreme Knight Mildner writing in the guest book of Rochester Council. After visiting with Dr. Kellner, Mildner expected to go to St. Catherine's, Ont. to see his daughter. He is a printer by trade.

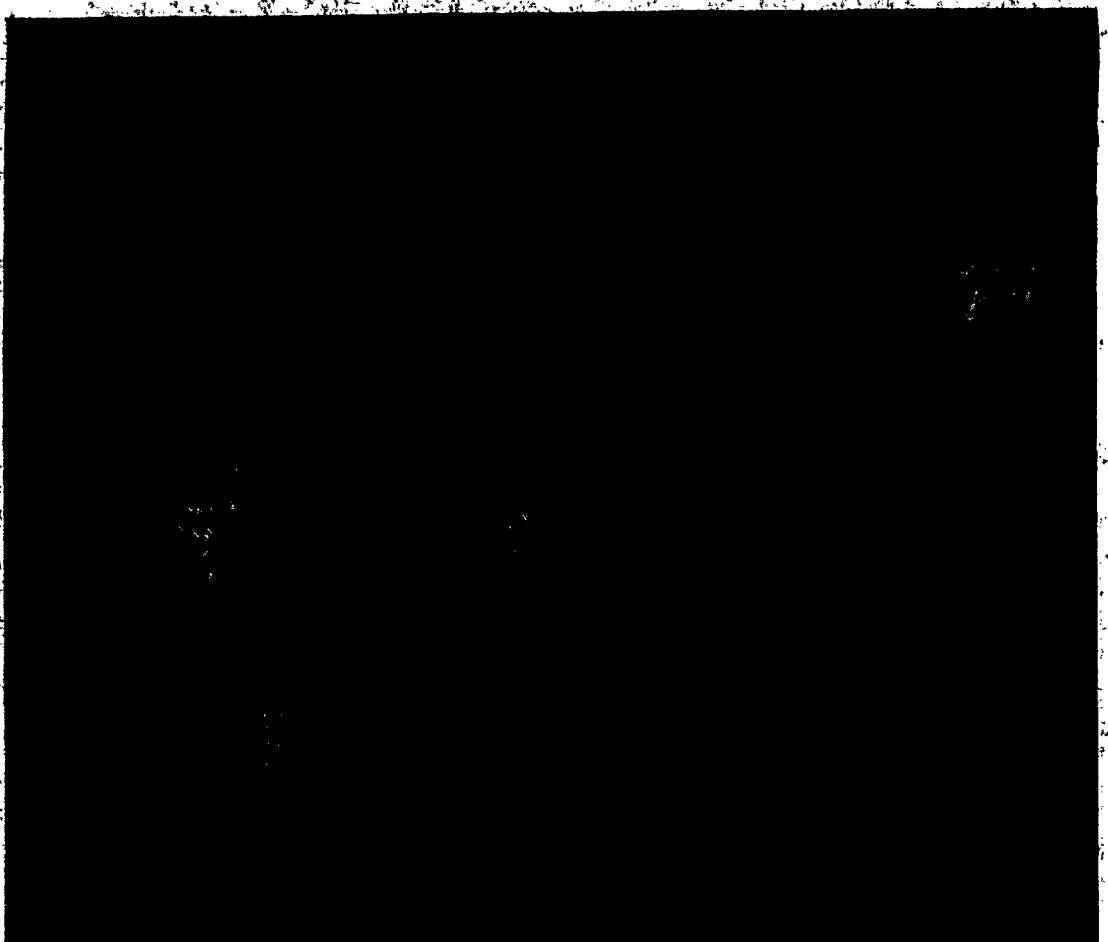
