Washington - (NC) - The Knights of Peter Claver, a 15,000-member Catholic men's society, has become the 20th national organization to be affiliated with the National Council of Catholic Men.

NCCM headquarters here said representatives of the 52-year-old fraternal benefit society are expected at the national council's biennial convention May 4 to 7 in Pittsburgh.

THE KNIGHTS of Claver were founded in 1909 and have headquarters in New Orleans. The society's members are divided among 200 units in 16 states.

The organization publishes a bimonthly magazine, The Claverite. Thomas R. Lee, Jr., of New Orleans is secretary of the society.
