

Cancer Topic Discussed At Holy Name Meeting

Auburn—Dr. Bernard J. Hartnett was the speaker at the meeting of Holy Name Society of Holy Family Parish recently in the school library.

Dr. Hartnett discussed cancer in men. He talked about the manifestations of the commonest, namely, of the skin, prostate, lung and stomach; and of the value of annual physical examinations, particularly after the age of 40. Persistence of symptoms is cause enough to see one's physician for examination, he stated.

In addition to the main methods of treatment (surgery and irradiation) usually employed, he spoke hopefully of the promise of effective treatment of some forms of cancer by chemical agents, saying that some of these agents already have been used with considerable success and are available.

In a question-and-answer period there was much interest and discussion of the relationship of smoking to lung cancer.

At the business meeting the present officers were elected for the coming year. They are Charles Geherin, president; James Condon, vice president; Ray Kenny, secretary; Dominic Padula, treasurer, and Raymond Wall, marshal.

Dr. Frederick R. Gabriel showed X-rays illustrating the kinds of cancer discussed by Dr. Hartnett.
