Russian To Be Taught Qualified Students Here

A second Summer Institute for the study of Russian by high school students, has been announced by McQuaid Jesuit High School. The Institute, which is open to qualified students from Monroe County, will run from July 5 to July 25, slightly longer than the Science Institute announced last week.

THE INSTITUTE stems from a realization of the growing importance of Russian as an intensive study in college and more immediately, from the presence at McQuaid since last December of a native-born Russian, Mr. Alexey Tsurikov, who is an instructor in German and French at the Jesuit school.

Four goals have been set for all participants in the Institute. At the conclusion of the 30 hours of instruction, divided evenly between classroom and language laboratory, each student should be able to understand, read, write and speak simple Russian. The ability to understand conversation would require a mastery of 500 to 600 Russian words and up to 100 idiomatic expressions.

Reading proficiency at the end of the course would extend to texts of ordinary difficulty with the aid of a dictionary. Writing would cover the translating of ordinary English sentences into Russian, while reading would have each participant able to carry on simple conversations in Russian. In addition to the above, a general introduction to and knowl-

edge of the Russian language will be acquired.

Deadline for applications is May 16. Inquiries should be directed to Mr. Tsurikov, who will both administer and teach the Institute.
