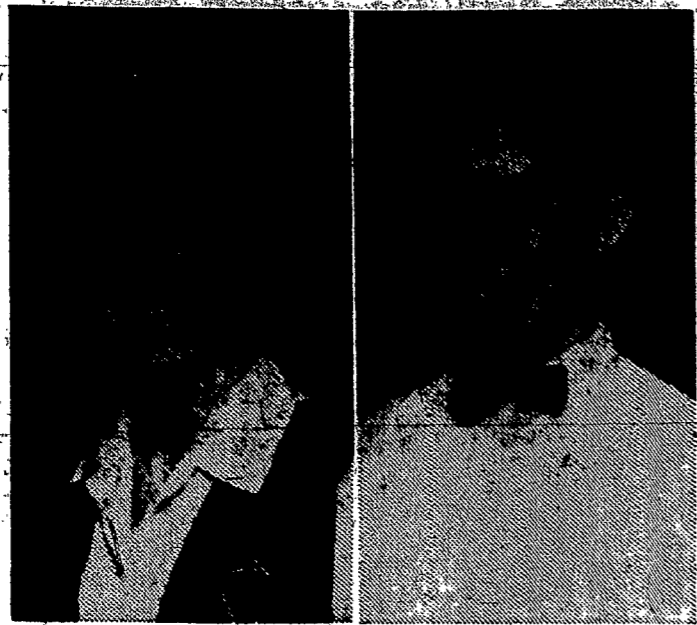

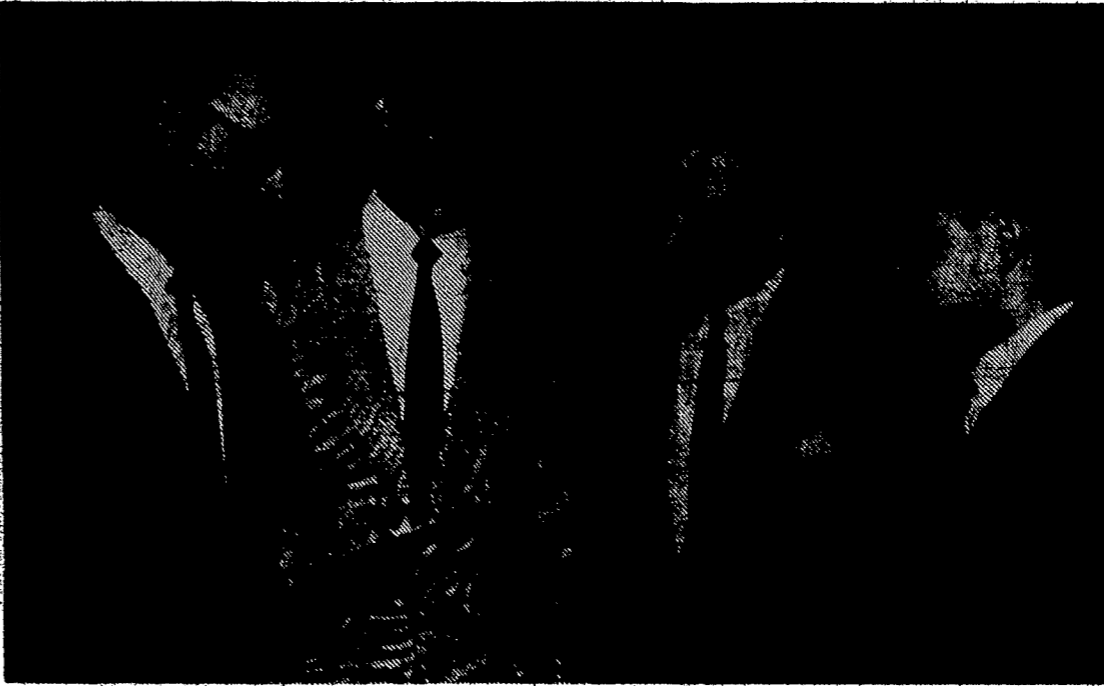
Chemung County Opens Drive For Celebration
