

Annual Spring Concert Listed At Mercy High

All three groups — orchestra, glee club, and freshman chorus — will be under the direction of Sister Mary Leo of the Mercy music department.

The two choral groups have been trained by Sister Mary Margaret, head of the school's music department. Accompanists will be seniors Mary Anne Schipper and Roberta Conway. The glee club's presentation of "Battle Hymn of the Republic" will be accompanied by trumpeter, William Pierce, a sophomore at Aquinas Institute.

The freshman chorus will sing a Civil War medley, including "When Johnny Comes Marching Home," "Tenting Tonight," "Tramp, Tramp, Tramp" and "Dixie."

Among the glee club's selections are: "In the Beginning Was the Word"; "Regina Coeli"; two Negro spirituals—"There is a Balm in Gilead" and "I Ain't Gonna Grieve My Lord No More"; "Madame Jeanette"; "Wake Thee Now Dearest," a Czechoslovakian folk song; "I Have Decided To Be an Old Maid"; an American folk song; and "A Dream is a Wish Your Heart Makes."

Another offering, the Modern Carnival of Melody, a medley arranged by Harry Wilson, will feature "Blue Moon," "Singing in the Rain," "Moonlight Serenade," "Hi-Lili, Hi-Lo," and "Love is a Many Splendored Thing."

The orchestra will be conducted through several musical moods from Anderson's "Jazz Pizzicato" through highlights from Sound of Music by Rodgers and Hammerstein.

Other orchestra selections include the "Finale" from Symphony in C Minor by Beethoven; Bach's "Arioso" from Cantata No. 156; the familiar "Waltz of the Flowers" from Tchaikovsky's Nutcracker Suite; Bizet's "Aragonesa" from Carmen; Brahms' "Hungarian Dances, Nos. 7 and 8"; and "Isle of Capri."

As a final offering, a flute trio will feature Sandra Frohm, Diane McCutchen and Margaret Murphy.

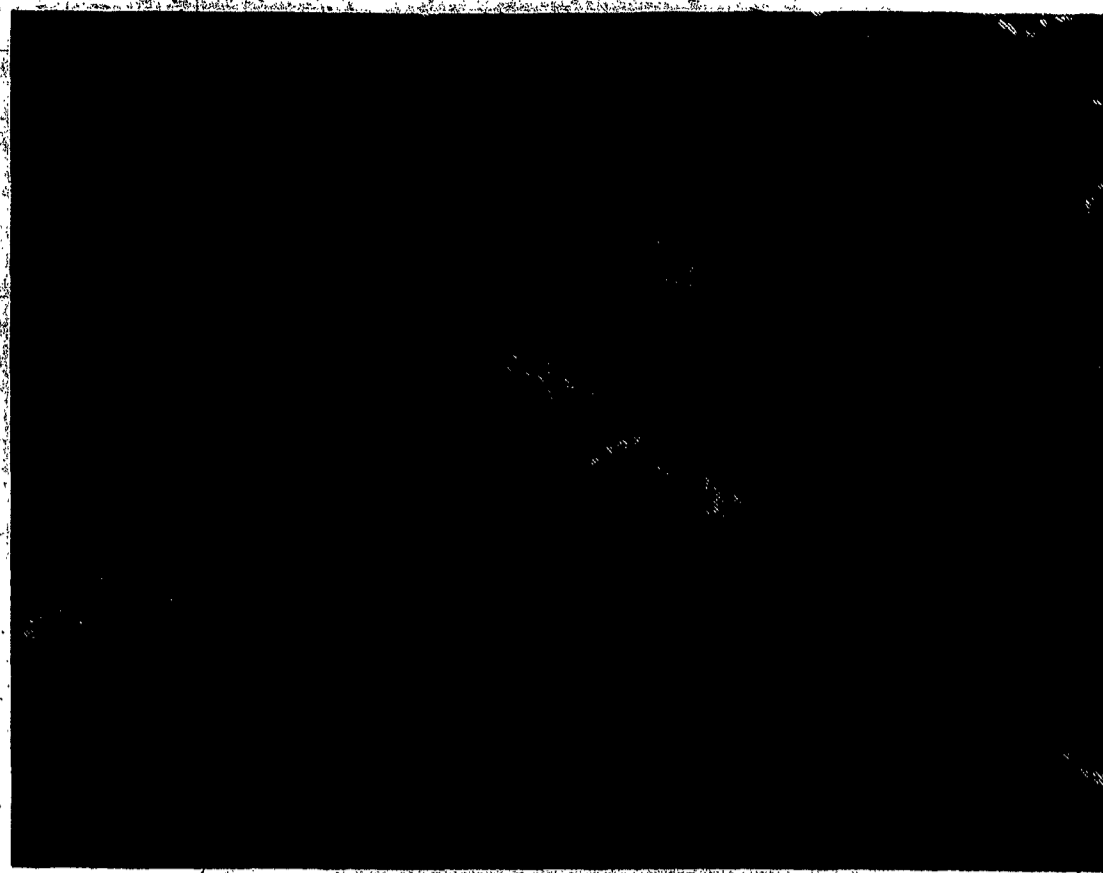

Fisher Glee Club Student Named Lists Alma Mater To Radio Post

The first official performance of St. John Fisher College's new alma mater will highlight the Seventh Annual Spring Concert of the Fisher Glee Club Sunday (May 14) in the college auditorium. The well-rounded program, directed by Marie Keber Burbank, also includes piano duos and a group of songs presented by the Nazareth College Glee Club. It will begin at 8:20 p.m.

The new alma mater recently selected from several entries submitted to the college, was composed by Edward Currie of Boston. Currie, long active in the music field as an instructor, arranger and accompanist to concert singers, is presently on the faculty of the Chaloff School and is choirmaster of the Church of the Immaculate Conception. He has contributed many poems, translations and musical compositions to various publications, notably the Plus X Hymnal and the New Saint Basil Hymnal.

The Glee Club will open its program with Benjamin Britten's "Deo Gracias" followed by "O Sacrum Convivium" by Remondini and Schubert's "Ave Maria" in honor of Mother's Day. "Trepak" Finale of the Nutcracker Suite by Tchaikovsky concludes the first group.

Concert Set By St. Agnes High Students Academy Music Groups Combine For Concert

Nazareth Academy will hold its annual spring concert on Monday and Tuesday evenings, May 22 and 23 at 8:15 p.m. in the school auditorium on Lake Ave.

The school band, orchestra, Freshman Chorus will combine their efforts in the program. The orchestra will open the concert performing under the direction of John Figueros, Sr. Orchestra selections include "Slavonic Dance" — Bolikov; "The Merry Widow" — Lehár; "Caucasian Sketches" — Ippolitov-Ivanov; "Highlights from the Sound of Music" — Rodgers-Muller. Mary Brigid Callan will play a harp solo. "Chanson dans la Nuit" by Salzedo.

The members of the senior class who are graduating in music will also play at the concert. Sonata Pathétique op. 79 No. 1, Brahms will be played by Ann Harrington; Soliloquy for Trumpet by Mary Gagnon accompanied by Ann Gagnon.

The Glee Club will be directed by guest conductor, David Fetter, D.M.A., of the Eastman School of Music. Mexican Theaters Explains Doctrines

Mexico City — (RNS) — The Mexican Empresarios Union, an association of theater and cinema owners, television and radio station managers and persons in related activities, pledged here to give maximum publicity to the social doctrines of the Catholic Church.

The association's members agreed that ignorance of Christian social teaching, particularly as set forth in the encyclicals of Pope Leo XII, has been a great advantage to Communists. In a resolution, they stated they would constantly urge the diffusion, explanation and publicizing of the Catholic doctrines in an attempt to inform Mexican employers how to preserve the dignity of their workers.

The spread of pro-Castro and pro-Communist sympathies in Mexico has caused alarm among Church leaders who have called for lay action in fighting Communist advances in the country.
