Rome — (NC) — A general chapter of the Discalced Carmelites has reelected Father Anastasio of the Most Holy Rosary as superior general of the worldwide order. He is an Italian.

EIGHTY-SEVEN representatives of the order's 28 provinces, two semi-provinces and a handful of mission areas took part in the election, held here on the first day (April 21) of the general chapter. There are more than 4,000 members of the order.

An American Carmelite, Father Albert (Bourke) of the Blessed Sacrament, was elected (April 22) an assistant superior general. He is a member of the Washington (D.C.) province.

Father Benjamin of the Holy Trinity, a Belgian, was reelected first assistant superior general. Other assistant superiors general elected were Father Hippolytus of the Holy Trinity and Father Victor of Jesus and Mary. Father Hippolytus and Father Victor are Spaniards.

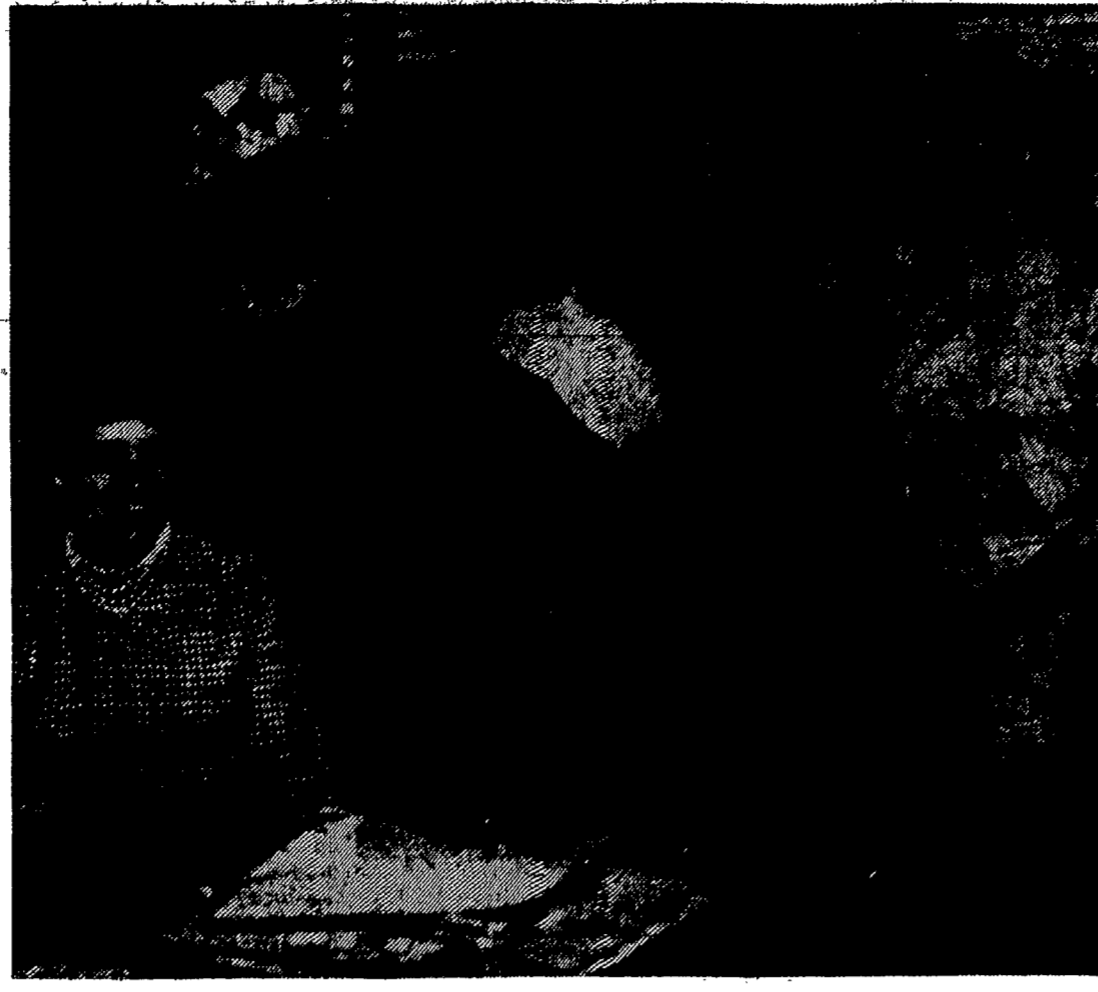

Music ranging from the works of Bach and Brahms to Rodgers and Hammerstein will be featured by the St. Bonaventure University Concert Band and Male Chorus during the Scholarship Benefit Show Wednesday, May 10 at 8:15 p.m. in the Notre Dame High School auditorium.

SELECTIONS TO be performed by the two groups were announced yesterday by Mathias F. Pennell, president of the Elmira Catholic High School — Notre Dame Alumni Association, the sponsoring unit.

The Rev. Paul J. Olligny, O.F.M., head of the St. Bonaventure Music Department, will conduct the 43-piece band. The 30-voice male chorus will be directed by Leroy Williams, an instructor in the university's Music Department.

The show, marking the fifth recent Elmira visit by the two groups, will open with two religious selections by the male chorus — "Hosanna in Excelsis" and "Ave Maria, Christe" by Palestrina.

Two other religious works by the chorus will be "Ave Maria" by Arcadelt and "Kyrie" by Yon. Other chorus numbers will include: "Die Musicanten," a German student song; "Barbara Allen," a folk song of Scotland; "O Mary Don't You Weep," a Negro spiritual; "Angeline Baker," by Foster, and "Trumpet Holiday" by Walters, will be presented by Samuel Mole, senior from Olcott.

Two students will render vocal solos. Walter Ulrich, a Junior from Brooklyn, will sing "Because" by Teichmeyer-D'Hardelot and "I'll Never Walk Alone" by Rodgers-Hammerstein.

Near-Blind Father Of Four Devotes Life To Sightless

St. Paul, Minn. — (NC) — A father of four children who is almost totally blind is devoting his life to aiding the blind.

When Edward Bohanon, a member of St. Mark's parish here, was told by doctors that his falling sight could not be saved, he was shocked, then inclined to be bitter. He credits a pilgrimage to the shrine of St. Anne de Beupre in Quebec with helping him adjust to the situation. He said he came away with spiritual strength and "determined to use it to aid other blind persons."

MR. BOHANON, who is 40, was assistant auditor at a St. Paul bank when his eyesight began to fall eight years ago. By 1955 he was blind in his right eye. Soon his sight was so bad that he had to give up his job.

Now he has just a spot of vision left. "But it's going fast,"
