
Washington, D.C., failed to impress at least one viewer when he appeared on television recently to argue for the Roman Catholic position on Federal aid to education.

As head of the education department of the National Catholic Welfare Council,

Monsignor Hochwalt is one of President Kennedy's leading antagonists on the school-aid issue. He concedes that his mail would indicate that many Catholics think the hierarchy is embarrassing the President.
