Lay Apostles Need Today Stressed By Fr. Hogan

Hornell — The role of the lay apostle is doubly important today to combat the growth of atheistic Communism and the widespread indifference of an alarm-

Father Hogan, professor of dogmatic theology at St. Bernard's Seminary, St. John Fisher College and Nazareth College, was principal speaker at the luncheon sponsored by Steuben Deanery, Diocesan Council of Catholic Women, in honor of Our Lady of Fatima. There were approximately 40 women present at the luncheon in the Knights of Columbus Home on River St.

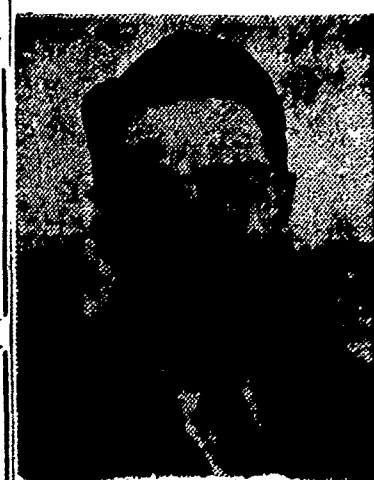
FATHER HOGAN, a native of Lima, was principal of De Sales High School in Geneva before going to Rochester. He completed requirement for his doctorate in sacred theology at the Angelicum in Rome.

"Each of us became lay apostles when we were joined to Christ through the Sacrament of Baptism. As members

of the Mystical Body of the Church which has Christ as its head, are responsible for the spiritual needs of our neighbor," Father Hogan said. He added:

"This obligation is imposed upon us since we are spiritual-ly equipped by the infallible teaching authority of the Church; spiritual maturity through the Holy Ghost in the sacrament of Confirmation; and the realization that Christian charity demands we love God above all things and our neighbor as ourselves.

"Our Blessed Lord came into this world to fulfill His three missions—as a Ruler, a Teacher and a Sanctifier. The power to rule belongs to Christ the King, but that of teaching and sanctifying, once relegated primarily to the clergy, now extends to the laity. Your power to sanctify and to teach can pervade many areas in the world today which are completely closed to the clergy because their role is taken for granted and thus rejected," Father Hogan continued.
