Pledge Payments Spur Building Of High Schools

"Again, the Catholic people of Rochester have shown their outstanding faith and great devotion to the education of our young people," Bishop James E. Kearney remarked today when he reported that the \$1,900,000 mark was reached in the Bishop's High School Fund Campaign.

The report represents payments made and recorded as of May 15. Robert A. Keleher, are continuing leadership in the Follow-Up Campaign. They expressed pride in the parishes in their areas and "look confidently to complete success in the pledge drive."

The bishop thanked publicly each donor for response both in the campaign and for conscientious payment of pledges made.

Included in the report made on page 3 are each parish's total pledges at the campaign's close, the total cash paid to May 15, and percentage of cash on the total subscribed.

"The payment in full by many donors has sparked the initial success of our first several months of pledge redemption," the Rt. Rev. Msgr. John S. Randall said after reviewing statistics today.

Monsignor Randall is county follow-up coordinator and construction coordinator of the campaign.

"THE HIGH percentage of those who pledged and have made their payments faithfully, each month," Monsignor Randall said, "practically assures us of a final redemption close to the total amount pledged."

If this pace continues, Monsignor Randall said, the Diocese of Rochester will have paid all its obligations on the two new high schools when they open their door in September, 1962.

Monsignor Randall expressed appreciation of the cooperation being given and stated that continuation committees are organized and parish level meetings are being held at which functions and responsibilities of members are outlined.

The follow-up headquarters is located in the Courier-Journal offices, 35 Scio St. under the direction of Auxiliary Bishop Lawrence B. Casey and Monsignor Randall.

Amounts approximating \$25,000 in new pledges have been received since the Continuation Committees have been working. More calls are to be made and more new pledges are expected from donors who did not have an opportunity to contribute during the campaign last fall.

Cardinal Spellman will be unable to attend the June 4 graduation ceremonies because of a detached retina. He is expected to spend another week in the Columbia-Presbyterian Medical Center in New York City and four weeks convalescing at his Madison Avenue residence.

THE CHANGE OF plans was announced yesterday by the Very Rev. Charles J. Lavery, C.S.B., president of the college.

"Although we are naturally disappointed that Cardinal Spellman cannot be here to help us mark the tenth anniversary of the founding of St. John Fisher College," he said, "it is particularly fitting that Bishop Kearney should take his place."

"He was instrumental in the college's foundation and, as chancellor, has maintained a keen interest in its welfare over the years."

Webster Parish Celebrates 100 Years

Bishop Kearney will pontificate at a jubilee Mass and preach the sermon marking the hundredth anniversary of Holy Trinity Church, Webster, on Sunday, May 28.

Cornerstone of the new church was laid on May 26, 1861. A Redemptorist Father celebrated Mass every two weeks in the Webster parish until 1867, when Father Hokin was appointed the first pastor.

A RECTORY was built west side of the school. At the same time the older school building was modernized and the following year extensive redecorating was undertaken on the church's interior.

The present church was built in 1901 under the pastorate of the Rev. Joseph Miller. A convent for the Sisters of St. Joseph who have staffed Holy Trinity School since 1881 was built in 1921.

Classes began in a new school building in 1927. Prior to this, the auditorium and cafeteria in the basement of the church were enlarged.

Today there are 504 pupils at Holy Trinity School which is supervised by the Rev. William Amann, assistant pastor. Sister M. Laurentia is principal, assistant pastor in 1939.

A NEW ORGAN was installed in the church in 1949 and the following year extensive redecorating was undertaken on the church's interior.

The first catechetical school in the area was built in 1953 on land donated by Frank Hosenfeld. The Rev. Elmer W. Heindl, then assistant pastor, was the school's first instructor.

Pastors who have served the Webster church include Fathers Joseph Netzel, Constantine Ulrich, Joseph Magin, Joseph Miller, William Stauder, Francis Hoefen and Jacob Rauber. From 14 families, Holy Trinity has grown to a parish of 680 families.

Graduation Speaker Set At Nazareth

Dr. John McKiernan, chairman of the English Department at the College of St. Thomas, St. Paul, Minnesota, will deliver the major address at the commencement of Nazareth College of Rochester, June 8. The oldest of his nine children, Dierdre, will be in the graduating class.

Dr. McKiernan joined the staff of the Minnesota College last September. Prior to that he

had spent a year in Ireland studying Celtic literature, foreign languages, and history at St. Thomas College, was to prepare Dr. McKiernan for leadership of a forthcoming center of Celtic literature and culture to be established at the college.

Born in New York City, Dr. McKiernan did his undergraduate work in literature, foreign languages, and history at St. Joseph's College, New York. After receiving his M.Ed. from the University of New Hampshire, he accepted a position at the State University of New York College of Education, Genesee, where he taught for 10 years.

Dr. McKiernan received his Ph.D. from Pennsylvania State University in 1957. His thesis was entitled "The Psychology of Nathaniel Hawthorne."

A prolific author, he has had articles and reviews published in Commonwealth, Catholic World, America, Progressive, New Hampshire Sunday News, Boston Sunday Post, and Catholic English.

Dr. Dooley Honor OK'd

Washington, D.C. — (RNS) — A bill authorizing \$2,500 for a gold medal honoring the late Dr. Thomas A. Dooley, famed Catholic jungle physician, was approved by the House Banking Committee here and sent to the floor.

DR. DOOLEY died of cancer in January at the age of 34 after several years fighting disease in remote Southeast Asian villages. He was co-founder of MEDICO, an international medical aid organization which has established hospitals and clinics in more than 10 Asian nations.

The doctor wrote three best-sellers based on his experiences in aiding underdeveloped countries.
