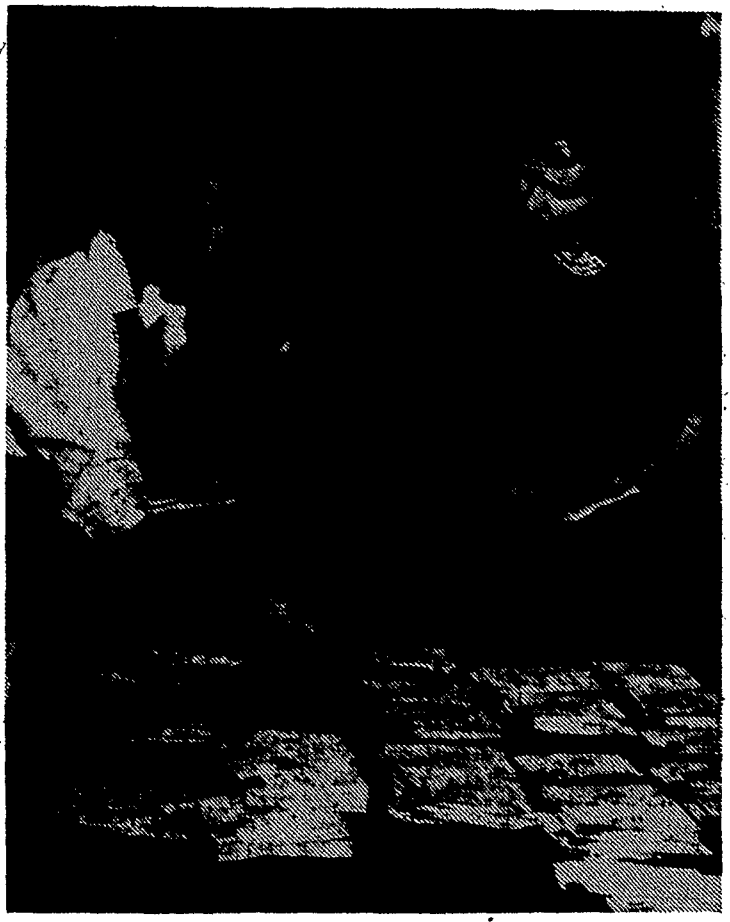

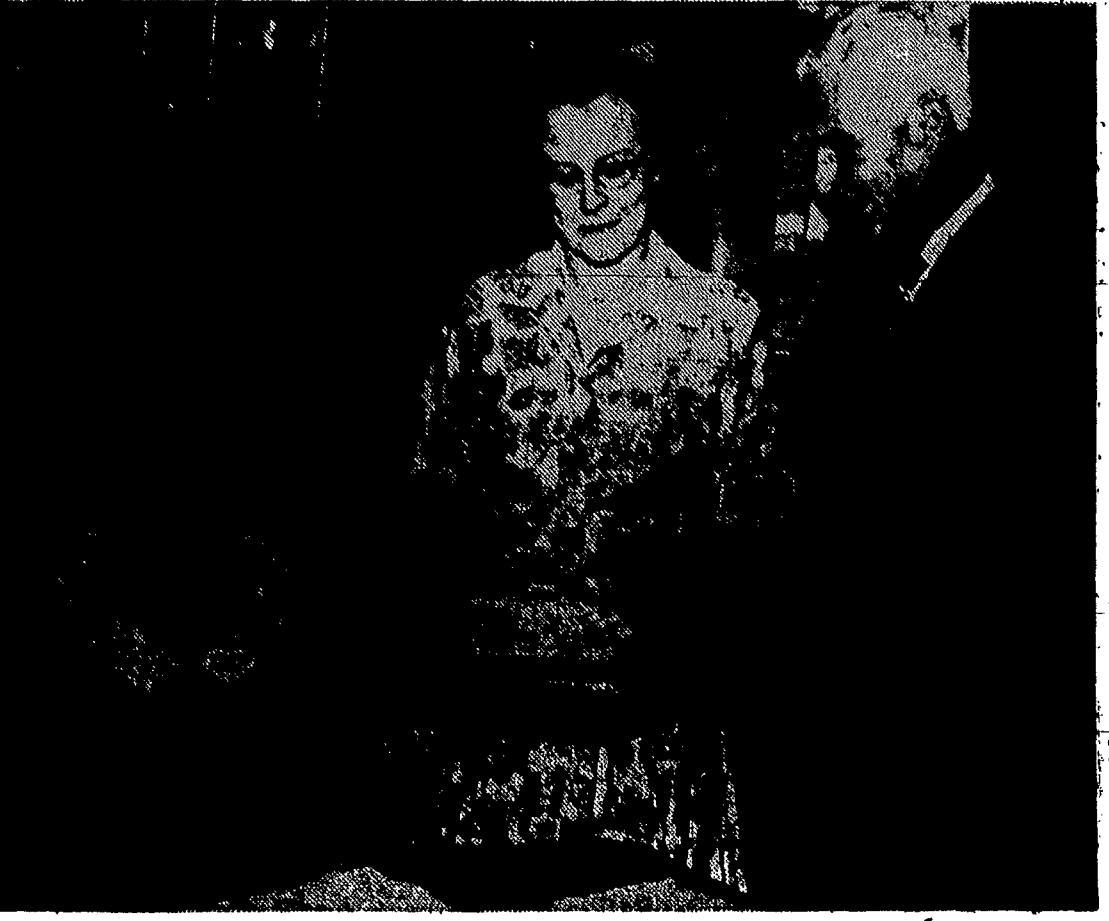

Pope Canonizes Italian Nun

Vatican City — (RNS) — A new name was added to the Church's roll of saints when Pope John canonized Sister Bertilla Boscardin, an Italian nun who died of cancer in 1922 at the age of 34.

Twenty-seven cardinals, all the bishops of Northern Italy — the new saint was a native of Brendola, a village in the north, west of Venice — and about 30,000 persons witnessed the solemn rites in St. Peter's Basilica as the Pope proclaimed the humble nun to be "a saint in heaven."

Among the congregation were two Italian women whom the Sacred Congregation of Rites had certified as having been miraculously healed by God through the saint's intercession. One of the women was Veronica Frigo, now living in the United States at West Allis, near Milwaukee, Wis., who was cured of ovalic acid poisoning at Cesuna, near Asiago, Italy.

Man Who Couldn't Forget Repays 'Debt'

Passaic, N.J. — (NC) — It took 63 years for David Gregory, 75, of Allentown, Pa., to achieve peace of mind. He did it with a check for \$1,000 sent to St. Mary's Hospital here, asking the institution to dedicate a room in memory of his wife.

On January 6, 1898, Mr. Gregory, son of Italian immigrant parents, underwent an appendectomy at the hospital. At the time the operation was considered major surgery and Mr. Gregory was given a 50-50 chance for recovery. He spent three months in the hospital recuperating. There was no bill when he was discharged—the Sisters of Charity who conducted the institution required payment only from those who could afford it.

David Gregory never forgot. He explained in a letter enclosing his check that St. Mary's "gave me life" and he had vowed to repay "the debt."
