

New 'Palm' Format Marks First Year At St. Agnes

In an unusual break with tradition, the present Senior Class of St. Agnes High School voted last spring to try a new type of school publication in place of the ordinary yearbook and news paper.

Retaining the name of the school's yearbook, the newstyle "Palm" has been published as a magazine five times this year. In a format unlike that of any other school publication in the East so far as the staff has been able to discover. It has con-

tained school news, fashion pages, poetry, short stories and essays, interviews, surveys, art work, and pictures.

ALL OF THESE have been planned, collected, and edited by the staff from the formative stage right through the finished layouts sent to the printer. In charge were Joann Hinz and Carole Smith as co-editors; Joan Brucker, news editor; Sally Beecher, feature editor; Jeanne Eismont, business editor; Linda Spoonhower, photography editor; Ann Ledoux, art editor.

As an integral part of the students' learning experience, the funnies for the staff members "Palm" has been rich in opportunity to acquire foresight, cooperative efforts, initiative, and dependability; for the entire school to have an extra goal for competent and creative writing.

THE MAGAZINE'S flexibility and adaptability to new ideas have pleased the staff members, while its clean, modern look and new approach to covering the life of a school year have attracted much favorable comment from outsiders.

Some tangible proofs of success have been achieved in the awards won by the "Palm" at the St. Bonaventure Press Day on May 11. A special Citation of Excellence was awarded the publication as a whole, and seven individual prizes were earned by staff members Geraldine Ebbsen, Marthe Mary Proud, Dorothy Munch, Kathleen Thane, Linda Spoonhower, and Ann Ledoux.

In line with one of the motives for starting this new publication — to combine the best features of a newspaper and a yearbook — the separate issues of the "Palm" have been collected from the girls, and bound into a hard cover; this "book of the year 1960-61 at St. Agnes High" will be given to each student this coming Monday, May 22.

Then, since the "Palm" was on an experimental basis this year, its continuance in this form depends upon the vote of this year's junior class.

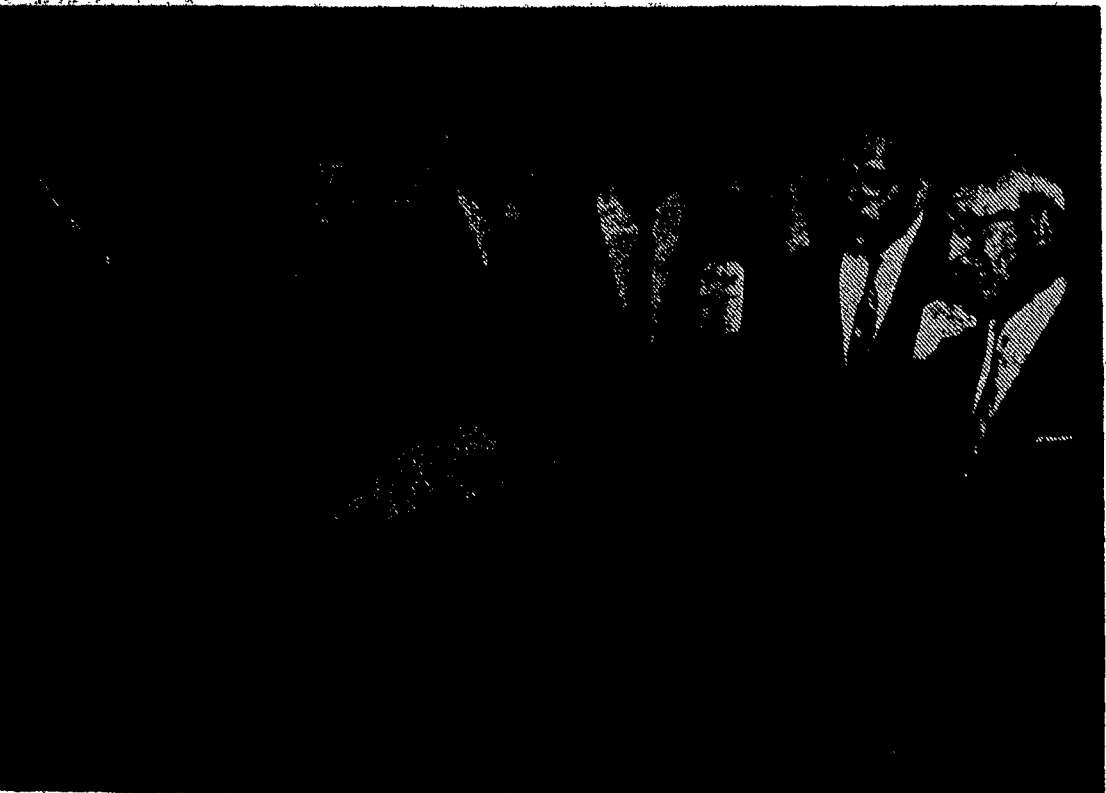

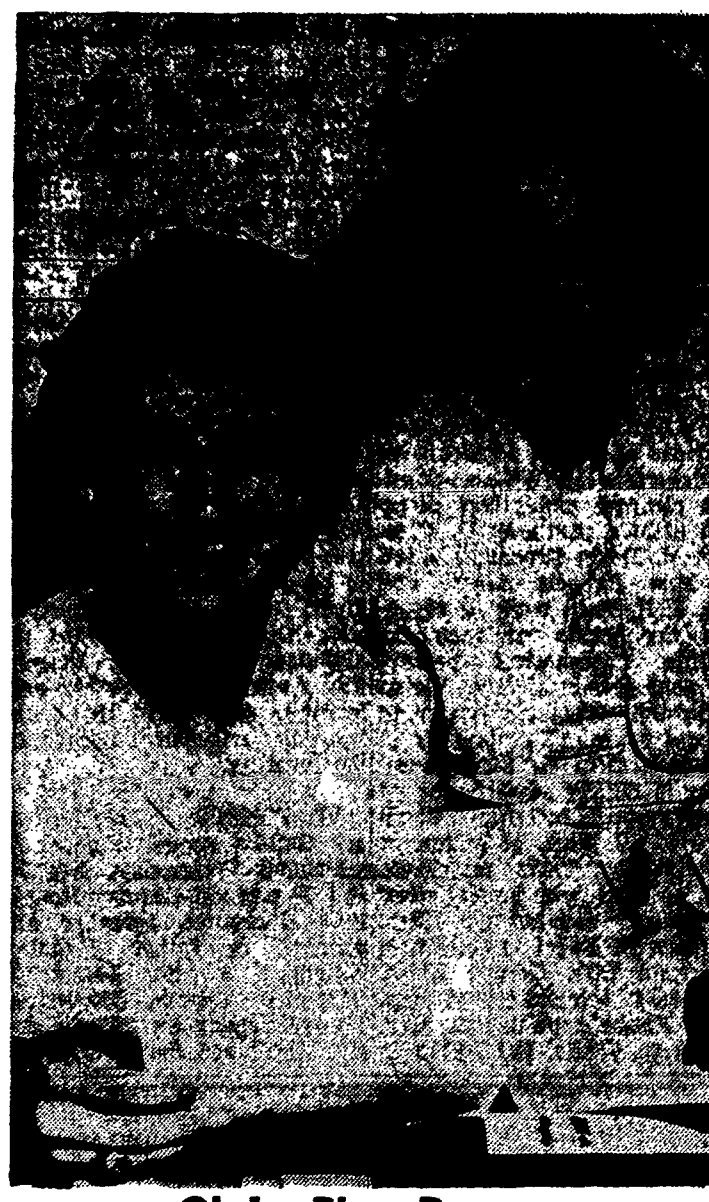
Bishop Kearney Listed By Holy Angels Guild
