Dinner for clergymen, relatives and friends followed at the Manger Hotel. A reception was held in the Manger ballroom from 8 to 10 p.m.

Monsignor Ratigan was appointed director of Catholic Charities of the Rochester Diocese and director-treasurer of Columbus Civic Center in December 1952.

He served as director of the Family and Child Welfare Division of the Diocesan Charities since 1939. Through his efforts the name of the social welfare division was changed to Rochester Catholic Family Center. Besides directing a large staff of social workers, Monsignor Ratigan expanded the service provided by Catholic Family Center, particularly in the field of marriage counseling and child study.

An alumnus of Aquinas Institute, St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries, Monsignor Ratigan's first assignment was as assistant pastor of St. Francis Xavier Church, Rochester. He also served as curate of Corpus Christi Church and chaplain at the former St. Mary's Boys Home and St. Patrick's Girls Home in Rochester.

Following two years of post graduate study, Monsignor was awarded the degree of Master of Science in Social Work from the Catholic University of America in 1942.

He also served as chaplain of Rochester Council, Knights of Columbus and moderator of the First Friday Luncheon Club. In October, 1951, he was presented the Memorial Chalice by Rochester Fourth Degree Assembly, Knights of Columbus.

Pope Pius XII elevated him to the rank of domestic prelate in 1956.

MONSIGNOR FLYNN will celebrate his jubilee Mass on Sunday, June 4, at 11 a.m. in St. Agnes Church, Avon.

Monsignor John M. Duffy will preach the sermon.

The jubilarian will be assisted by Monsignor Arthur E. Ratigan as deacon and Monsignor Gerald C. Lambert, subdeacon.

A parish reception will be held from 4 to 6 p.m. in St. Agnes School Hall. Mass will be offered for the children of St. Agnes School on Tuesday, June 6 at 9 a.m.

Son of Maurice and Elizabeth McCammon Flynn, Monsignor attended St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries.

Following ordination, he was appointed assistant pastor of Our Lady of Mount Carmel Parish, Rochester.

Monsignor Flynn was appointed editor of the Catholic Courier Journal in 1943, a post he held for 15 years.

During his tenure, the Courier Journal gained national distinction as one of the finest Catholic newspapers. His "On Guard" column was long a favorite feature of the diocesan paper.

While editor, Monsignor Flynn also became well known as an intermediary between employer and worker in labor disputes. He served on the Mayor's committee to eliminate obscene publications from Rochester.

ester newsstands and was diocesan director of the Holy Name Society. During the war years, he acted as auxiliary chaplain to Navy and Marine students at the University of Rochester.

Pope Pius XII honored him with rank of papal chamberlain in 1956.

Monsignor Flynn left the Courier Journal in 1958 to take up the duties of administrator of St. Agnes Parish in Avon.

FATHER AMANN, because of illness, will mark his anniversary privately with his family.

An alumnus of St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries, Father is the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Anthony Amann.

During his twenty-five years in the priesthood, Father Amann has served at Holy Family Church, Rochester; St. Agnes Church, Avon; Holy Trinity Church, Webster; St. Anne's Church, Palmyra; St. Cecilia's Church, Elmira; St. Mary's Church, Dansville and St. Michael's Church, Lyons.

He was assigned pastor of the Cato and Red Creek parishes in 1958.

FATHER BOLGER will celebrate his anniversary Mass on June 11 at 11 a.m. in St. Theresa's Church, Stanley.

Sermon will be given by Monsignor Joseph J. Sullivan.

Father Bolger will be assisted by Father Gerald G. Kelly, deacon, and Father Joseph T. Gaynor, subdeacon.

A reception will be held at St. Theresa's rectory from 4 to 6 p.m.

Son of John and Joanna Bolger, the jubilarian attended Aquinas Institute, St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries.

His first assignment as a priest was to St. Margaret Mary's Church, Rochester. Father Bolger served as an Army Chaplain from 1942 to 1946.

Following the war, he was appointed to Holy Apostles Church, St. James Church and Immaculate Conception Church, all Rochester parishes.

Father Bolger became pastor of St. Theresa's and St. Mary's in 1958.

FATHER DAVIS will offer his jubilee Mass on June 11 at 12:15 p.m. in St. Cecilia's Church, Elmira.

Monsignor Leo G. Schwab will preach the sermon.

Assisting Father Davis will be Father Vincent Davis, S.S.C.C. deacon, and Father Joseph Hogan, subdeacon.

A public reception will be held in St. Cecilia's hall from 4 to 6 p.m. A dinner for the Elmira clergy is scheduled for Sunday, June 18, in the rectory.

Father Davis is the son of William and Julia Byrnes Davis. He graduated from St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries.

After ordination, he served as assistant pastor at St. Patrick's Church, Owego; St. John's Church, Spencerport; St. Augustine's Church, St. Margaret Mary's Church, Rochester; Our Lady of Lourdes Church, Elmira; Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church, Rochester.

He was appointed pastor of St. Mary's Church, Rexville and St. Joachim's Church, Canisteo in 1957. Two years later, Father Davis was assigned the parishes of St. Cecilia's Church, Elmira.

FATHER HANNA, who is a patient at present in Walter Reed Hospital, will mark his silver jubilee at a future date.

A graduate of Rochester's minor and major seminaries, he is the son of the late Frank N. and Margaret Lonergan Hanna.

After ordination, Father Hanna served as assistant pastor at Holy Cross Church, Rochester, and St. Aloysius Church, Auburn.

When the Selective Service Act was passed in 1940, Father Hanna and his classmate, the late Father Edward Waters, were the first priests to enter the service as chaplains.

Father Hanna was assigned to Fort Ethan Allen, Vermont, and later, to the hospital at Fort Devons, Mass.

Promoted to the rank of Captain, he was appointed to the War College in Washington in 1942 where he celebrated the first afternoon Mass on August 7 of that year.

Father Hanna was raised to the rank of Major in 1943. He was assigned the chaplaincy at St. Joseph's Villa in 1946 on departure from the Army where he had gained the title of Lieutenant Colonel.

FATHER HEINDL will celebrate his jubilee Mass on Sunday, June 4, at 12:15 p.m. in St. Theodore's Church, Gates.

The jubilarian will be assisted by Father Raymond J. Epping, deacon, and Father John Steger, subdeacon.

A dinner for clergy, family and friends will follow.

A public reception will be held from 4 to 7 p.m. in the parish Social Center.

Son of Mr. and Mrs. William C. Heindl, Father Heindl served as assistant pastor at St. Mary's Church, Dansville; St. Alphonsus Church, Auburn, and St. Andrew's Church, Rochester, before enlisting as an Army chaplain in 1942.

His assignment to Fort McClellan, Alabama, was followed by a tour of duty in the Pacific which resulted in his being decorated with the Distinguished Service Cross for exceptional bravery by General MacArthur in 1945.

The citation carried with it commendation for aiding the wounded under fire. He also received the Silver Star and the Bronze Star.

After four years in the Pacific, Father Heindl returned to the United States and was assigned chaplain at Rhoads General Hospital, Utica.

He conducted the first Canal Conference held exclusively for and by military personnel on any post when chaplain at Aberdeen Proving Ground, Maryland, his last Army post.

While serving as chaplain of the 98th Division on summer reserve duty at Fort Dix, N.J., in 1959, Father Heindl was awarded the rank of Lieutenant Colonel.

Still active in the reserves, Father Heindl served as assistant pastor at Old St. Mary's Church, Rochester, and Holy

Trinity Church, Webster. He was appointed pastor of St. Bernard's Church, Scipio Center in 1958, with missions of St. Hilary's Church, Genoa, and St. Isaac Jogues Church, Fleming. He received his present assignment to St. Theodore's Church, Gates, in 1960.

FATHER MALONEY will celebrate his jubilee Mass on June 4 in Immaculate Conception Church, Ithaca, at 11 a.m.

Monsignor Donald Cleary will give the sermon.

Priests of the parish will act as deacon and subdeacon.

A dinner will follow for clergy, relatives and friends.

Public reception will be held in Parish Hall from 4 to 6 p.m.

A native of Elmira, Father Maloney is the son of Mrs. John S. Maloney and the late Mr. Maloney.

An alumnus of St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries, Father Maloney was appointed assistant pastor of Blessed Sacrament Church, Rochester, after ordination.

He entered the armed forces as a chaplain in 1942 and served with the 101st Airborne Division in Europe. His battle honors include the Distinguished Service Cross, the Presidential Citation with the Oakleaf Cluster and the Purple Heart with the Oakleaf Cluster.

Father Maloney received the DSC from General Bradley for personal valor on D-Day when he parachuted with his men, armed only with the Blessed Sacrament, into Normandy.

He holds the Presidential Citation on two scores. His regiment was cited for action in Normandy and his division received the same citation for its historic defense of Bastogne during the Battle of the Bulge. At the Bastogne engagement, Father Maloney was wounded twice.

Retiring from the Army with the rank of captain in 1945, Father Maloney was assigned as curate to St. Patrick's Church, Elmira, and two years later was appointed spiritual director of St. Bernard's Seminary.

He served afterwards as assistant pastor at Immaculate Conception Church, Ithaca; St. Margaret Mary's Church, Rochester; and Our Lady of Lourdes Church, Elmira.

In 1959, Father Maloney was appointed pastor of St. Mary's of the Lake Church, Ontario, from where he was assigned to Immaculate Conception Parish, Ithaca, in 1960.

FATHER O'CONNELL will celebrate his jubilee Mass on Sunday, June 4 in St. Mary's Church, Waterloo, at 12:15 p.m.

Sermon will be preached by Father John D. Malley.

Father O'Connell will be assisted by Father Richard C. O'Connell, deacon, and Father George E. Gauthier, subdeacon.

A reception will be held from 3 to 5 p.m. in the school hall.

Born in New York City, Father O'Connell attended schools in Clifton Springs and is a graduate of St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries. Both of his parents are deceased.

Following ordination, Father O'Connell was appointed assistant pastor of St. Patrick's, Rochester, and in 1940 he was transferred to St. Lucy's Church.

In 1953, he was assigned to the pastorate of Epiphany Church, Sodus, and the mission churches of St. Rose, Sodus Point; St. John Fisher, East Bay; and St. Mary Magdalen, Wolcott.

Father O'Connell was named pastor of St. Mary's of the Lake Church, Ontario in 1956. He became pastor of St. Mary's Church, Waterloo, in 1959.

FATHER O'MALLEY will celebrate his anniversary Mass on Sunday, June 18, in St. Mary's Church, Bath, at 12:15 p.m.

Monsignor Thomas G. Horan, S.T.D., of Marywood College, Scranton, Pa., will preach the sermon.

The jubilarian will be assisted by Father Norbert L. Nolan, deacon and Father John P. Norris, subdeacon.

A reception will be held at 3:30 p.m. in the parish hall.

Son of Patrick J. and Jennie Flaherty O'Malley, Father O'Malley is a graduate of St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries.

His first appointment after ordination was as assistant pastor of St. Ann's Church, Hornell, from where he was transferred in 1943 to St. Francis of Assist. Church, Auburn.

In 1944, Father O'Malley joined the armed forces as a chaplain and served until September 1946.

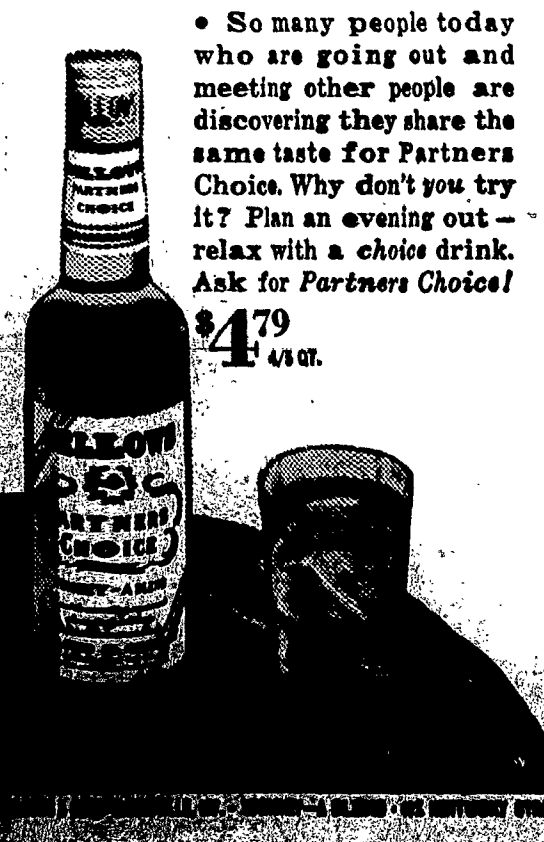
