# Nazareth College To Graduate 127

Nazareth College will graduate 127 seniors, largest class in the school's 38-year history, in rites to be held on the East Ave. campus Monday, June 5 at 4 p.m.

**BISHOP KEARNEY** will preside at the graduation ceremony and Dr. John McKiernan, chairman of the English Department of the College of St. Thomas, St. Paul, Minnesota, will give the commencement address.

The senior class consists of 118 lay students and eight Sisters of St. Joseph and one Trinitarian Sister. Of that number, 73 reside in the Rochester Diocese. States other than New York represented in this year's class are Connecticut, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Michigan, Minnesota and New Jersey.

## St. Lawrence Dedication Slated

Auxiliary Bishop Casey will offer Mass and dedicate the new St. Lawrence Church, Greece, this Sunday, May 28 at 11 a.m.

**SERMON WILL** be given by the Bishop and the church choir will be directed by Donald J. Kridel with Philip G. Kreckel at the organ.

A dinner for clergymen, relatives and friends will follow at the Ridgemont Golf Club. The Bishop will preside also of the parish's first Confirmation services at 4:30 p.m.

Located at 1000 North Greece Road, the new church is a blend of Colonial and Georgian architecture, designed for the most part by the pastor, Rev. Edward A. Shamon. Much of the actual labor was done by a

volunteer force of 200 men from the parish.

Ridgeway Avenue forms the southern boundary of St. Lawrence parish. Latta Road runs east to Long Pond Road, while Manitow Road bounds it on the west. An imaginary line drawn through the westernmost point of Ridgemont Plaza forms the eastern boundary from Ridgeway Avenue to Maiden Lane, where it turns east to Long Pond Road, and finally ends at Latta Road. In this section of Greece, there are about 400 families.

**ORGANIZED IN** August 1959, the parish had no church building, but held its initial service in the Greece Town Hall. Subsequently, services were held in the Ridgcrest Shopping Center, known among the parishioners as "the cata-

combs." In October of that year, ground was broken for the new church located on a 54-acre site. A ranch house across the road from the property was purchased to be used as a temporary rectory.

The pastor continued to hold services at the Shopping Center until the fall of 1960. On October 30, 1960, the Feast of Christ the King, Father Shamon assisted by Rev. Lawrence Murphy and Rev. Henry Atwell, celebrated the first Mass in the new structure. In addition to parishioners, many clergy and lay people throughout the city attended this first service.

Although the basic and necessary parts of the building were completed, much additional work was still to be done — painting, electrical work, landscaping and so forth. The men of the parish, who worked on the main building project, continued to lend their assistance. Such additional features as the mosaic and tester for the altar, confessionals, the "crying room," a special "Mary's Chapel" (to be used for daily Mass during the winter months) and the Baptistry will be ready for Sunday's dedication.

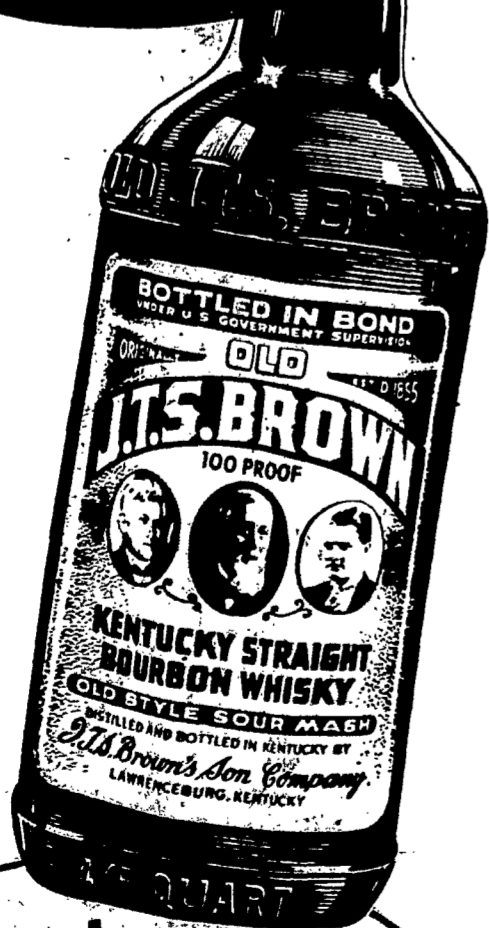
**ONE OF FATHER** Shamon's first acts after his appointment as pastor, was the establishment of a Rosary Society and a Men's Club. First presidents were Mrs. Charles Cummings and James Dooley. These societies have not only been responsible for great spiritual activity and the maintenance of church property, but have also through various fund-raising projects made appreciable financial contributions.

Current presidents of these societies are Mrs. John Tschiederer and Jack Ross. As a volunteer secretary, Mrs. Colin Tracey has also given assistance to the pastor. John G. Sillick and Sarto W. Stallknecht were appointed as trustees. Stallknecht served as chairman for the Memorial phase, Sillick for the general phase of the combined high school and building fun appeal.
