With a minimum goal of \$150,000, parishioners of St. Mary's Church, Horseheads, have started a campaign to finance construction of a four-classroom addition to the parish school, a lower-level church as part of the same structure and a substantial reduction in the parish debt, according to an announcement of Rev. Francis J. Reilly, pastor.

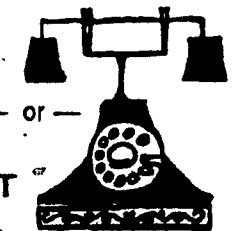

## St. Stephen Fund Over Subscribed

Geneva — A total of 898 parishioners pledged a total of \$3,340 a week for three years in St. Stephen's Church Campaign for Increased Revenue it was announced at the official closing of the drive.

The special campaign aimed toward paying off the debt on St. Stephen's Church Corp. within three years, can be considered an "outstanding success," according to the Rev. Raymond P. Nolan, pastor. As result of the drive, church officials hope to liquidate a debt of \$195,000 and to care for maintenance and other expenses common to extensive parish property.

ANOTHER SIMILAR drive at St. Francis de Sales parish is still underway, however, and will continue through June 9. Purpose of this drive to increase weekly revenue is for renovation of St. Francis elementary school and the addition of more classrooms.

To date, a total of \$3,390 has been pledged. "We're very pleased," the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Edward K. Ball, V.F., pastor, said. He advised that there are still a number of contacts to be made.

The additional amount promised by St. Stephen's parishioners is more than has been averaged weekly, Father Nolan explains. He believes the church debt can be paid "with comparative ease on the basis of the campaign agreements."

THE PASTOR expressed his "sincere thanks" to all workers including Robert Brennan, general chairman, assisted by Thomas A. Mulcahy, chairman. Its responsibility will be to do follow up work and to contact the few prospects not reached the past several weeks.

The drive at St. Francis to raise approximately \$105,000 for improvement of school facilities, is headed by Joseph Felice, general chairman, assisted by Michael Simeone and Richard Walsh. General chairman of special gifts is Dr. Charles Mascari, assisted by Harry Touhey and Robert McCarthy.

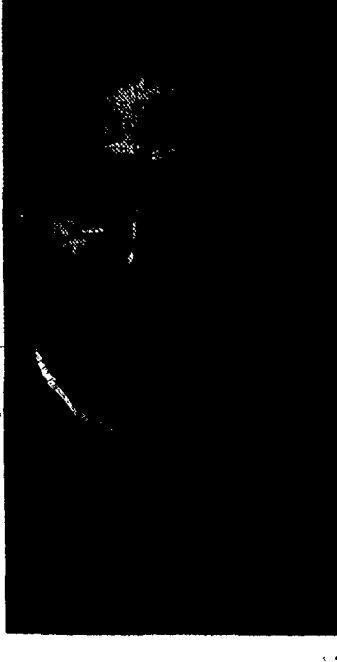

Two local Auxiliaries were awarded honors for membership at the State convention held May 18 to 21 at Kingston, N.Y.

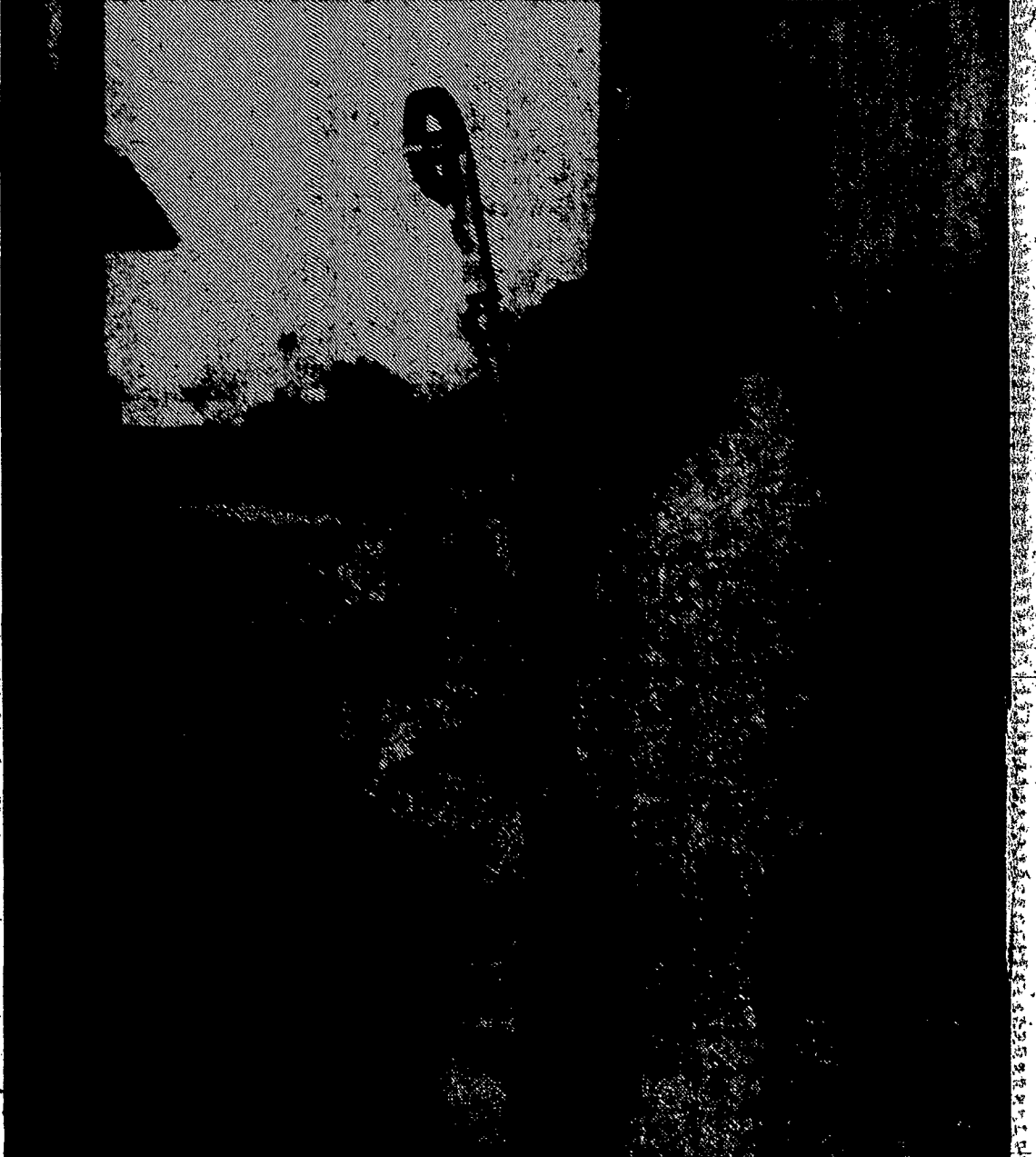
