It said the cult members venerate Americans but are fanatically bent on assassinating Queen Elizabeth of England in reprisal for the ill-treatment they claim to have received from Australian administrators.

The station's report on the cult, known as "Iliat," was based on information from Father Joseph Reischl, a Catholic missionary stationed at the Tavui mission six miles from Rabaul in the northern part of New Britain.

Father Reischl said native "priests" distribute among their followers a "magic powder" which is said to have been made from the scraped bone of

an American soldier's skeleton. The priests, he reported, tell the natives that Americans and Japanese will soon help them drive the Australians from New Guinea and that an American submarine will come to take them overseas to kill Queen Elizabeth.
