

New Bishop To Address Seminarians

Commencement speaker at St. Andrew's Seminary this Sunday will be Bishop-elect John F. Whealon, named this week to be Auxiliary Bishop of Cleveland.

Bishop Kearney will preside at the graduation rites in the school's auditorium at 2:30 p.m.

He will present diplomas to forty-nine young men who will continue their studies for the priesthood in major seminaries this September.

The graduation class includes students from the New York archdiocese and the dioceses of Rochester, Syracuse, Pittsburgh and Miami.

Other graduation events, a dinner with the Bishop Saturday evening and Mass in the seminary chapel Sunday morning.

Valedictorian will be William McPeak.

Bishop-elect Whealon, a noted Scripture scholar, is rector of Borromeo Seminary, Cleveland.

Of this group, three young women won honors in two academic departments: Miss Christian in English (magna cum laude) and Philosophy (cum laude); Miss McGinnis in history (magna cum laude) and sacred theology (magna cum laude); and Miss Koch in speech (cum laude) and sacred theology (cum laude).

Other double honor winners were: Mary Kay MacNamara, Rochester, in history (magna cum laude); Sister Adrienne Brennan, S.S.J., in Latin (cum laude) and philosophy (cum laude); and Sister Margaret Vadas, S.S.J., in French (cum laude) and philosophy (cum laude).

Scholastically the top three students in the graduating class were Miss McGinnis, Miss Koch and Miss MacNamara. All had grades of 2.8 or higher.

Rome — (RNS) — An exhibit of paintings on the persecution of the Catholic Church in Communist China opened in the art gallery of the Basilica of Santa Maria Sopra Minerva here.

The paintings were first shown at the 37th International Eucharistic Congress in Munich, Germany, last August. Later they were on display in other parts of Germany and in France and Belgium.

It is expected that eventually the works of art will be offered as a gift to Pope John XXIII for the Vatican galleries.
