Mercy Nun To Receive Her Doctorate

Sister Mary Bonaventure Hall, R.S.M., will receive her doctorate of philosophy degree in the field of education from Saint John's University, New York, at baccalaureate ceremonies there Sunday, June 11.

SISTER RECEIVED her master of science degree in mathematics from Notre Dame University in 1958, her bachelor of arts degree from Nazareth College in 1945. Educational administration has been her area of specialization in her doctoral studies.

She is chairman of the mathematics department at Catherine McAuley College and teaches mathematics and Latin at Our Lady of Mercy High School where she has taught for fifteen years.

Graduation exercises, including the baccalaureate Mass, will be held at the Jamaica campus in Long Island. Rev. Daniel Munday, C.P., vice president of the University, will present the degree candidates; Bishop Bryan J. McEntegart, of Brooklyn and chancellor of the University will give the commencement address and preside at the dedication of the new Saint John's University Alumni Hall on the same occasion, according to Reverend John A. Flynn, C.M. President of the University.

On Saturday a program of meetings, recreation and religious services will be conducted at Camp Columbus.

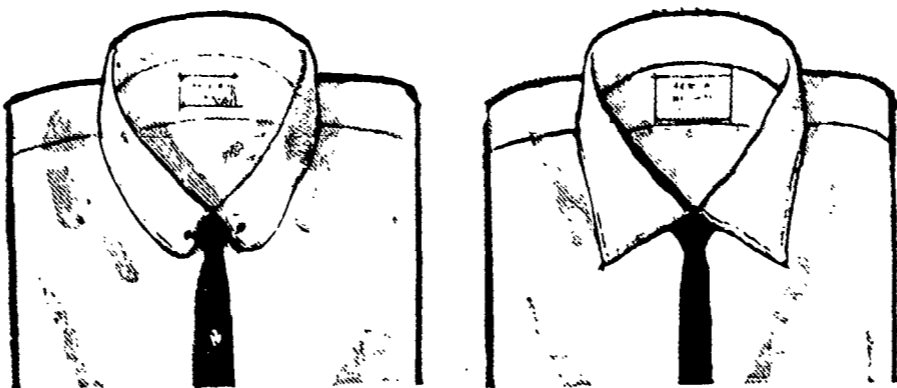
