He attended St. Ambrose School and Aquinas Institute before entering St. Basil's Novitiate where he made his first profession of vows on August 15, 1951. He attended St. Michael's College of the University of Toronto, and received a B.A. degree in Modern History and Modern Languages in 1956.

He was then appointed to the faculty of Aquinas Institute where he taught from 1956 to 1958. In 1958 he received a Master's degree in Education from the University of Rochester.
