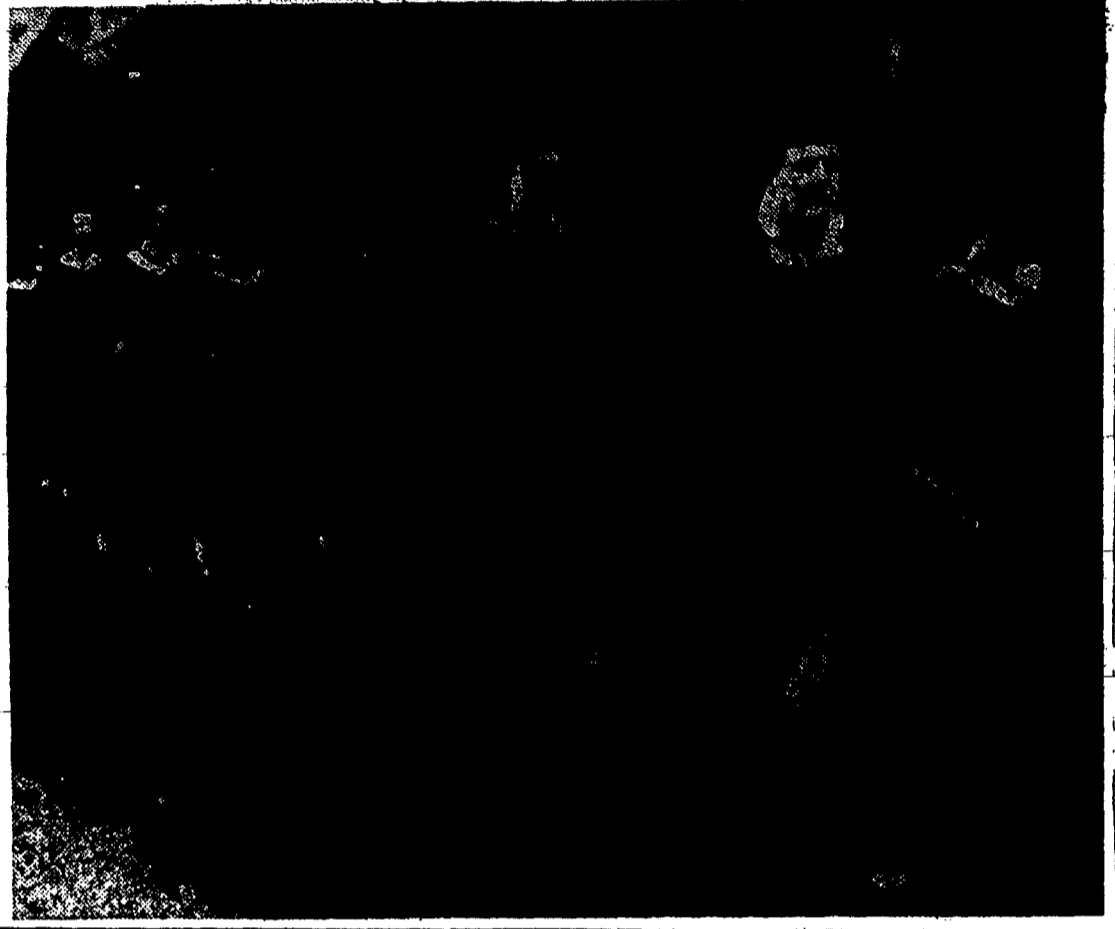
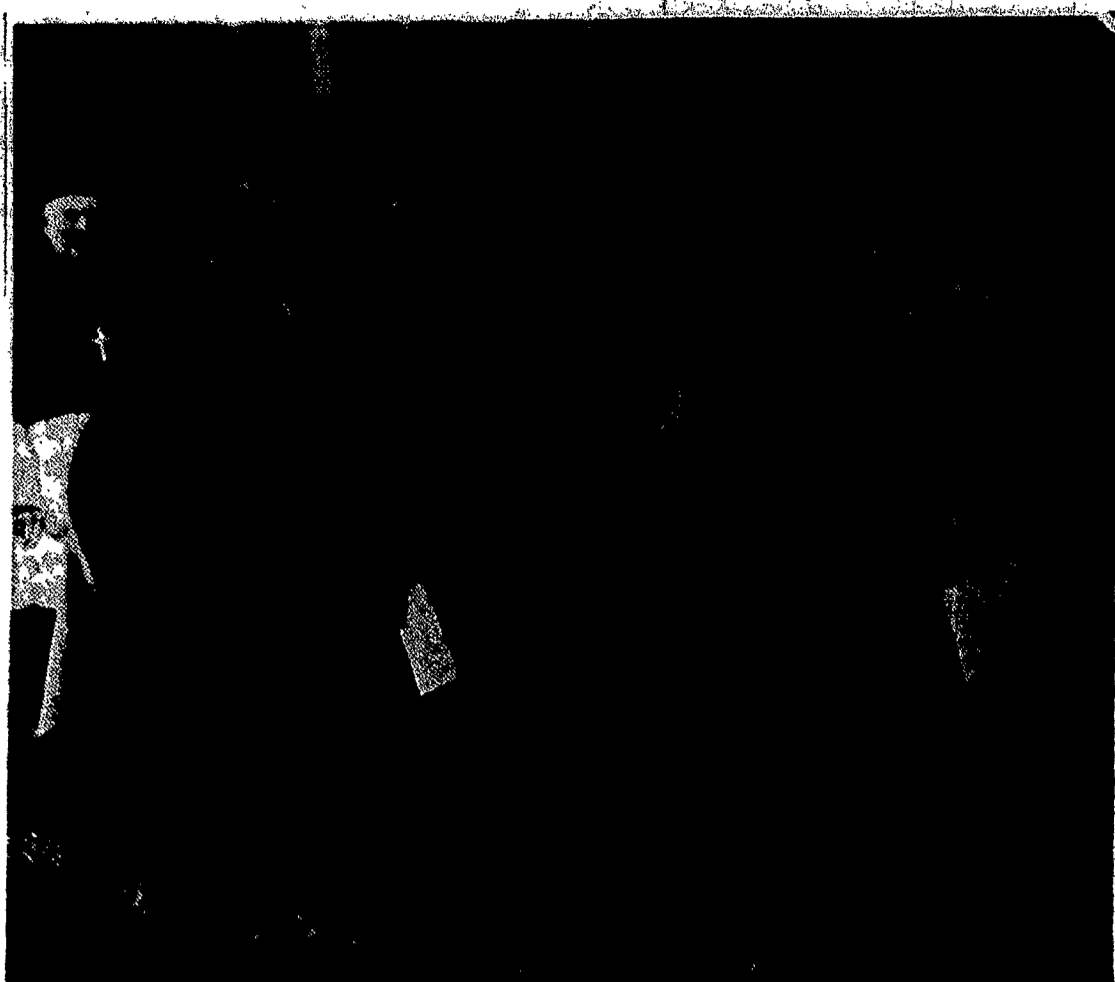

New Robes At Fisher
