### Germans Spur Rise In Economy

Cologne — (NC) — Germany's senior cardinal has given vigorous backing to the government program aimed at giving workers a greater chance of owning land and becoming shareholders in industry.

In a Lenten pastoral letter devoted mostly to social and economic matters, Joseph Cardinal Frings said that more widespread distribution of ownership would not only raise the living standards but strengthen the economy as a whole.

Cardinal Frings, Archbishop of Cologne and president of the German Bishops' Conference, urged workers to take advantage of Germany's present prosperity by putting part of their earnings into investments.

THE PASTORAL touched on many topics. Among them: — The need for a youth corps to aid underdeveloped nations. "Would it not be wise for young people of various occupations to go abroad to the underdeveloped countries for a few years to help in the construction of new installations? Without such personal aid, the great work of helping the underdeveloped countries cannot really get going."

— The need for bishops and pastors to recognize that they cannot act autocratically. "Even the bishop cannot and should not govern his diocese in a purely patriarchal and absolute manner. The cathedral chapter and the administrative council have been established to advise him, and he is required to obtain their agreement in the case of any important decision."

— The "difficult and unhealthy situation" created by working mothers. Cardinal Frings urged increased benefits by the German family allowance system, which now provides about 10 dollars a month for every child beginning with the third, but makes no provision for the first two children.

USE YOUR HEAD, MAN!

Xerxes was a powerful King of Persia and was feared by everyone. His will was law and he would not countenance any opposition whatsoever. In order to make it easier for his army to cross over from Europe to Asia he decided to build a floating bridge over the waters. But his powerful bridge was not able to withstand the pounding of the sea and the wild waves. It broke into a million pieces like so many matchsticks.

Xerxes was so upset because his plans were thwarted that in his rage he decided to punish the sea. He ordered that 300 strokes of the lash should be administered to the sea. Angrily, he shouted, "Cruel sea, you now meet your master and we measure out to you because you have opposed our plans."

Now this was just about as silly as one can get. This man, king or not, needed a session with a head shrinker. I don't have to tell you the rest of the story because you know, I am sure, that the strength of the waves were not diminished one iota by the punishment of Xerxes.

There are times when we act just about as foolishly as Xerxes. It happens when we fail to accept that which cannot be changed. . . . In short, fail to face self evident facts. The world may treat us harshly, it can be the death of a loved one . . . a father or a mother or even a child. It can strike us down with serious illness which puts us on the flat of our back for months or years. It can happen that we be separated from our married partner or one who is very dear to us. The world will find a thousand ways to bring discord into our life. But to refuse to accept the inevitable, even though it is highly displeasing, is tantamount to beating the sea with a whip.

All of our troubles are not going to be resolved today. Some take time. If we continue to fight the things which cannot be changed then really do we put on the role of the fool. If we get out the whips and lash the sea, the sea goes on its merry way.

Let's change the things we can . . . accept the things we cannot change . . . and pray to God for the wisdom to know the difference.

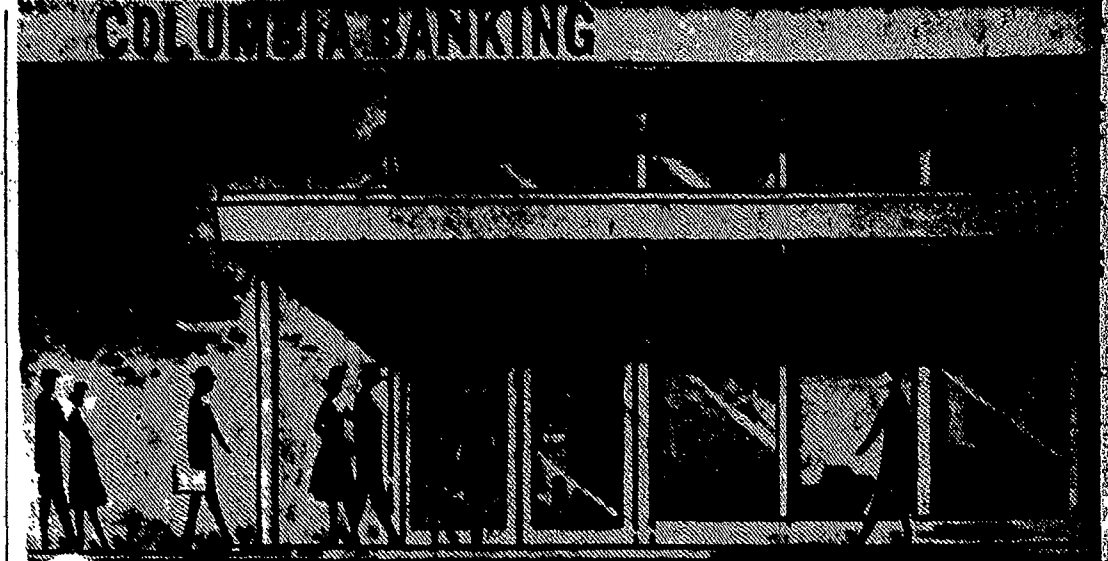
### ND Foundation Aides Chosen
