Father James T. Mulligan has been appointed Administrator of LeMoynes College, Syracuse.

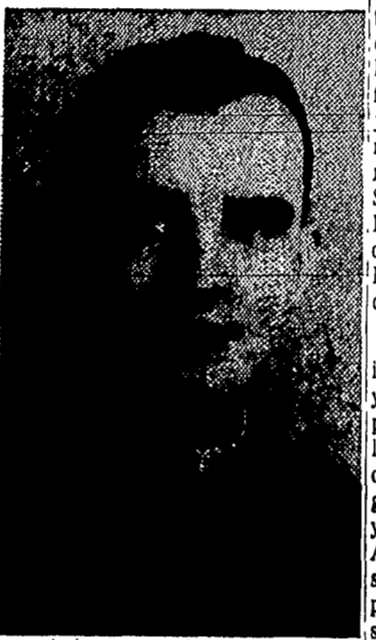

Together with five other members of the newly formed Buffalo Province of the Society of Jesus, Father Fitzpatrick will be ordained at Canisius College, Buffalo.

After his ordination, Father Fitzpatrick will be in Rochester for one week and will celebrate his first Solemn Mass at St. Boniface Church on Sunday, June 25 at 11 a.m.

Assisting the celebrant will be the Rev. Francis J. Taylor, pastor; the Rev. Robert J. Boyle, S.J., rector of McQuaid Jesuit High School and the Rev. Richard C. Kinsky, C.S.B., of Aquinas Institute, will be deacon and subdeacon.

The sermon will be preached by the Rev. E. Charles Bauer, chaplain of Newark State School.

Richard Fitzpatrick, brother of the celebrant, now a student

for the Priesthood at St. Bernard's Seminary will be master of ceremonies.

Eldest boy in his family, Father Fitzpatrick received his early education at St. Margaret Mary's School. Upon graduation from Aquinas Institute, he joined the Society of Jesus. He made his religious vows at St. Isaac Jogues, Wernersville, Pa. and then went to St. Andrew-on-Hudson, Poughkeepsie, N.Y., where he completed his classical studies.

The next six years were spent in the Philippine Islands; three years were spent studying philosophy at Berchmans College, Cebu City where he received his B.A. and M.A. degrees. During the last three years he was stationed at the Ateneo de Cagayan, a Jesuit school in the Southern Philippines where he taught high school boys and helped in the running of the board school.

In 1958 he returned to the United States and began his theological studies at Woodstock College, Maryland.
