Each section of the book is introduced by an original painting of modern design and includes a brief section of Father Magee's biography which is completed in seven sections.

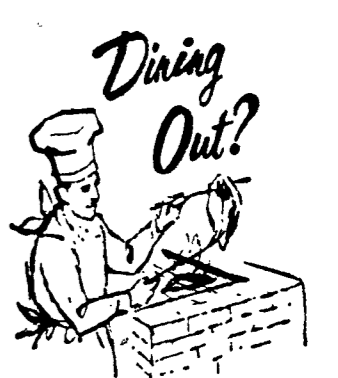
Area Freshmen Cited At NDU
