The whimsical musical-comedy "Once Upon A Mattress" will be the second presentation in the Corning Summer Theatre schedule. This is the enchanting story of a delicate princess based on the Hans Christian Anderson fairy-tale, "The Princess And The Pea."

The part of the delicate princess was played by bombshell Carol Burnett in the original Broadway production. This fanciful musical with the satirical twist has kept audiences "rolling in the aisle" since its opening in New York two years ago. The carousing brother-in-law, Sid Davis, is simultaneously the grand old vaudevillian, the master of the belly laugh and the song-and-dance man who returns to his hometown to re-charm his old sweetheart, Lily.

The intellectual son, Richard, stakes out his own domain in the play as he tries to prove to his true-love, Muriel, that an adolescent's fondest hope is to be given several opportunities to die gloriously in the name of true love. He makes it seem almost a pity that he not only survives, but goes to Yale as well. Featured in the Town And Country production of "Take Me Along" will be John Fredericks as Nat Miller and Louise Kirtland as Lily.

The show will run from Monday, July 3 to Saturday, July 8 with a 2:30 matinee on Wednesday and a 5:00 p.m. twilight performance on Saturday in addition to the regular evening performances. During the program, the Rev. Joseph B. Schuyler, Professor of Sociology at Fordham University, New York, will discuss with Dr. George Crothers, the moderator, the question: Is marriage from God?

Jacques Lowe's photographs will show the young couple choosing their furniture, having their apartment blessed, meeting with their families during the engagement ceremony, discussing with their priest, in the pre-Cana conference, both the problems they will face in married life and the spiritual aspects of marriage, and the wedding ceremony itself.
