Two Colleges Set Summer Classes

Classes will begin next Friday (June 30) in the first summer session offered jointly by Nazareth College and St. John Fisher College.

Among the new features of the six-week summer program will be a special state-sponsored course in Mathematics for Elementary School Teachers, a science workshop, and an American Film Festival.

REGISTRATION for the six-week program will be held at Nazareth College Wednesday, June 28, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Directors of the summer session will be Sister Catherine of Nazareth and Dr. Charles J. Meder, D.S.S., of St. John Fisher.

In addition to instruction in French and Spanish, Economics and Philosophy, the program includes courses of particular interest to students in education and political science. English and history will be available on both the undergraduate and graduate levels.

Classes will be held on both campuses. Five courses — Investment Analysis, Production Management, Theory of Communism, Economics and Basic Freshman English — will be held Monday through Thursday evenings at St. John Fisher.

The state-sponsored, three-credit course in Mathematics will emphasize the modern approach to Mathematics through the understanding of fundamental concepts and operations. Specific reference will be made to arithmetic textbooks containing modern methods and materials. Tuition grants are available to qualified teachers on application to the chairman of the Nazareth College Mathematics Department.

EXPERTS in the teaching of elementary school science from six of the dioceses of the state will gather at Nazareth for the science revision workshop. Under the chairmanship of Sister Marie Immaculate, C.S.J., Rockville Centre diocesan school supervisor, the group will study the total science program of the first nine years of school.

Another summer session "first" primarily intended for faculty and students will be a film festival featuring some of the most widely acclaimed motion pictures ever produced in America. Ranging from Orson Welles' Academy-award winning "Citizen Kane" to John Ford's classic western "My Darling Clementine," the film program

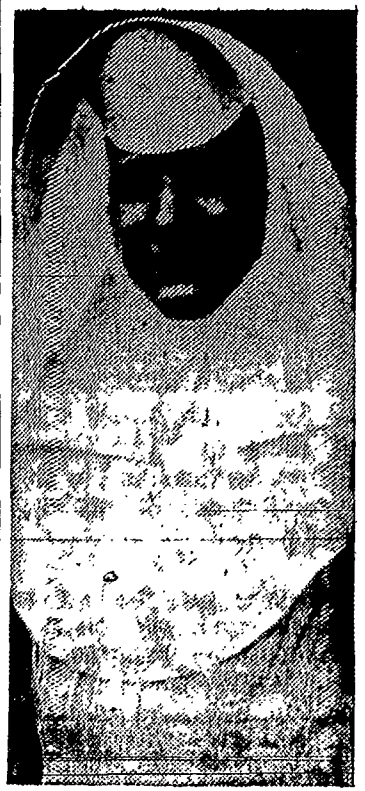
THEY WERE awarded a "Ph.D. Degree" in Reading for reading and reporting on fifty approved books per pupil, since last October.

'Intern' at Post Office

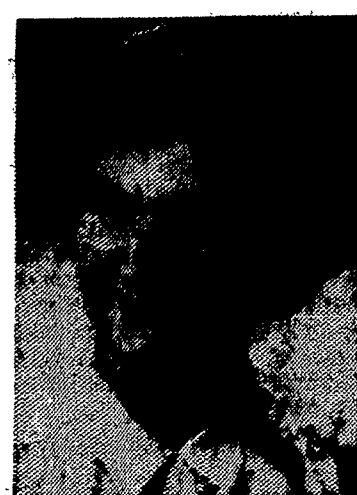
A Nazareth College senior has been appointed an intern in an experimental program to attract outstanding college students to the federal service, according to an announcement made by Dr. Martin B. Dworkis, professor of Public Administration at New York University and chairman of the board of directors of the Federal-College Internship Program.

ALICE A. MCKAY of 112 Broadway Street, a history major at the college is one of 25 students in colleges in the states of New York and New Jersey selected by the Board.

A total of 165 applications were received for the internships which are financed under a grant by the Ford Foundation to the Board of Higher Education of the City of New York and are under the sponsorship of the College-Federal Agency Council of the second United States Civil Service Region.

The 25 students come from 22 colleges and universities: nine from New York City, three from New Jersey, and thirteen from upstate New York schools. There are 14 males and 11 female appointees, ranging in age from 18 to 26.

Under the terms of the Ford Foundation grant, Miss McKay will receive a scholarship

stipend of \$400 for a full-time summer internship of eight weeks at the Rochester Post Office. In addition, she will be granted a monthly allowance for part-time work experience during the academic year. She will work eight hours a week at the Rochester Post Office.

during a seven-month period from October until May. Each intern will receive college credit for the program.

Sister Eva Marie, director of Guidance and Placement at Nazareth will serve as campus coordinator of the program. In addition to work experience, the interns will participate in a series of meetings in the New York metropolitan area and will spend one week in Washington, D.C., meeting with federal agency heads and observing the workings of the federal government at central and headquarters establishments.

Miss McKay is a graduate of Nazareth Academy where she was a member of the National Honor Society. The recipient of a Rochester Polish Club Scholarship, she is on the literary staff of World Student Magazine and is a member of the History and International Relations Clubs at Nazareth. She is one of nine children.

Off To Oklahoma Mission

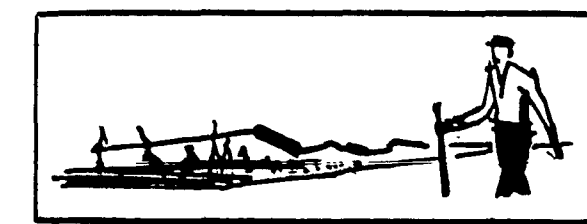
