St. Joseph Nuns List Summer Reading Course

The Sisters of St. Joseph will offer again Reading Courses for children of Grades 2 through 9 this summer. The Science Research Associates approach to improvement in reading will be used. The Sisters have been using this system for the past three years, in specialized reading classes during the school year, as well as in summer classes.

CLASSES ARE very small, no more than 7 pupils, so that the teachers can detect the difficulty of each child and aid him or her to overcome it. The classes stress comprehension skills, mastery of vocabulary, word analysis, and speed.

The Controlled Reader, a mechanical device for strengthening comprehension, increasing speed and promoting fluency in oral reading, will be used with pupils who need it.

In Rochester, the Summer Reading Centers will be Nazareth College, Nazareth Hall Cadet School, and St. Monica's School. Immaculate Conception School, Ithaca, and St. Agnes School, Avon, will also conduct reading classes.

Teachers conducting the summer classes are certified and experienced in the field. The classes will be under the direct supervision of Sister Matilda and Sister Mary Elizabeth, who will attend the Reading Institute at Marquette University.

Franciscan Third Order Lists Profession Rite

The regular monthly meeting of the Third Order of St. Francis of Assisi will be held at 3 p.m. on Sunday, June 25, at St. Patrick's Church, 445 Plymouth Ave. N. All who are interested are welcome to attend.

Instructions for postulants and novices will precede the religious services conducted by the Rev. Bonaventure Brown, O.F.M., Provincial Regional Director of the Third Order.

PROFESSION OF tertiaries who have completed their novitiate of a year and a day will take place with special ceremonies, during which they will be reminded that the Third Order gets its spirit entirely from the Gospel of Jesus Christ and is adapted to all conditions of life, and that it is a true order, founded by St. Francis for people living in the world, and approved as such by the Catholic Church in 1221.

It will be brought to mind that it is practical Christianity intended for the married and single of both sexes, although members take no vows, and that it is a definite rule of life for those who would devote themselves to the glory of Christ and the prosperity of the Church.

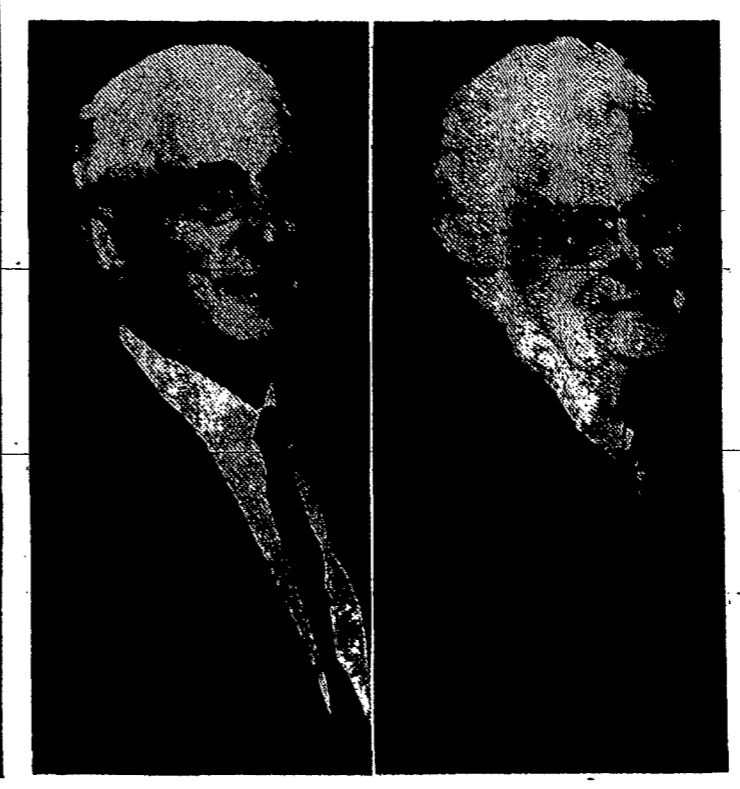
