

# Fairport Rite Honors High School Graduates

Funeral Mass for Gerald G. Vogt, president of Joseph Shale, Inc. piano and organ store in East Ave. and organist and choir director of Old St. Mary's Church was offered in that church Tuesday, June 20.

BISHOP KEARNEY presided at the Mass and gave the Final Absolution.

Mr. Vogt, 47, widely known in musical circles of Rochester died unexpectedly June 17, 1961.

Solemn Requiem Mass was celebrated by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. James C. McAniff, P.A., V.G., assisted by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. John E. McCafferty, deacon and the Rev. L. John Hedges, subdeacon.

Also attending were the Right Reverend Monsignors John E. Maney, Chancellor of the diocese, Arthur E. Ratigan, Thomas F. Connors, Very Reverend Monsignor Edward J. McAniff, Leslie G. Whalen, and many other priests of the diocese.

Since 1946 Mr. Vogt was organist and choir director at St. Mary's and as a student at Eastman School of Music until he entered the Army Air Corps in 1942, he was organist at Corpus Christi Church.

Born in Wayland, Mr. Vogt attended St. Joseph's School and Wayland High School before entering the Eastman School of Music here. He was graduated from the Eastman School in 1938 and became staff organist at WHEC radio station, a post he held until about 1954.

## Law Degree Received By J. Valenti

Joseph A. F. Valenti, 24, of 183 Lyell Ave., in St. Anthony's Parish, received a bachelor of laws degree from St. John's University School of Law in New York City on Sunday, June 11. Valenti is a graduate of Corpus Christi School, Aquinas Institute and St. Michael's College in the University of Toronto.

Valenti entered St. John's Law School in September, 1958 and was elected vice president of the Student Bar Association, Class of 1961, and served as

parliamentarian of that body during his senior year. He was also elected to the Phi Delta Phi International Legal Fraternity and served that group, too, as parliamentarian.
