Brooklyn — (RNS) — The Brooklyn Catholic Interracial Council issued a statement here supporting the Freedom Riders testing segregation practices in interstate bus travel and the rights of sit-in demonstrators in southern states.

"We recognize as morally justified the legitimate aspiration of Negroes in the South to enjoy an unsegregated existence and to exercise the full rights' of American citizenship," the statement said.

In support of the Freedom Riders and sit-in demonstrators, the CIC group said: "We realize that in some southern states this cannot be achieved in the foreseeable future merely by education, and, therefore, that other moral and lawful methods must be utilized in order that an entire group of American citizens may not see themselves and even their children deprived of their human rights."


