Brooklyn Council Endorses 'Riders'

Brooklyn — (RNS) — The Brooklyn Catholic Interracial Council issued a statement here supporting the Freedom Riders testing segregation practices in interstate bus travel and the rights of sit-in demonstrators in southern states.

"We recognize as morally justified the legitimate aspiration of Negroes in the South to enjoy an unsegregated existence and to exercise the full rights of American citizenship," the statement said.

In support of the Freedom Riders and sit-in demonstrators, the CIC group said: "We realize that in some southern states this cannot be achieved in the foreseeable future merely by education, and, therefore, that other moral and lawful methods must be utilized in order that an entire group of American citizens may not see themselves and even their children deprived of their human rights."

Twins Take Degrees, Grants

Gerald S. Ponticello and Ignatius S. Ponticello, twin sons of Mr. and Mrs. Angelo Ponticello of 91 Canton St. and members of Holy Apostles Parish, were graduated June 1 from St. Michael's College of the University of Toronto, with bachelor of science degrees. They both entered the General Course in Science and were chemistry majors. Both Aquinas Institute graduates received in their third year "The College Proficiency Prize in the General Course in Science." Ignatius also had the distinction of being first in his class in the same year. Both were among the first graduating class of the newly formed course at the University of Toronto. While maintaining good grades both took great interest in the sports activities of the college. They were members of the St. Michael's College Football team and various other intramural sports. In their Junior year the twins received a minor letter and in their senior year both received their major letter. In the fall, they will both enter the University of Illinois on a \$2,000 assistantship and tuition and fees scholarship in the Department of Chemistry. They will be working toward their doctorate degree in Inorganic Chemistry. They also received a similar offer from the University of Rochester worth \$3,300.

Self-discipline Needed

Hartford — (NC) — A U.S. Senator told Catholic youths be strong. "If the average American is dedicated to preserving his civil rights and freedoms to win the battle against world communism, then our country will be effective in extending those rights and freedoms."

"It will be your fate either to meet and throw back the advancing tide of communist tyranny or to be subjugated and enslaved by it," said Sen. Thomas J. Dodd of Connecticut at the ninth annual congress of the Catholic Youth Organization and the Catholic Young Adult Clubs.

"You are opposed," the Senator asserted (June 18). "By millions and millions of youths who are ruthlessly disciplined and purposefully directed, not to serve their own well-being but to advance the well-being of the regime which has sworn to bury us. Your opponents will win unless you become willing volunteers in the struggle to preserve and extend freedom."

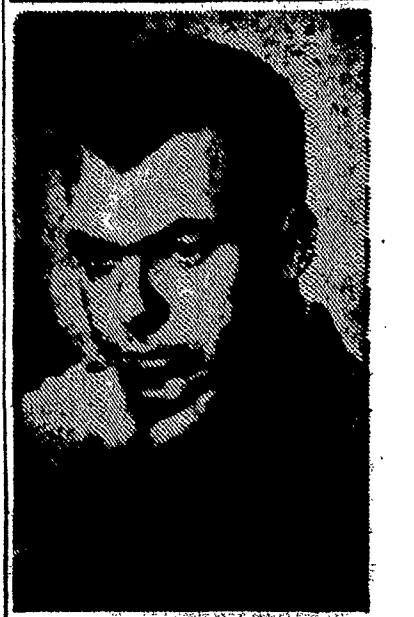
Calls For Moral Vigor

Boston — (RNS) — Richard Cardinal Cushing, Archbishop of Boston, warned here that America's military, political and economic powers will be ineffective "if we lack the moral vigor and spiritual determination to use them when necessary" against the "international conspiracy" of communism.

"If the Communists can be convinced that we are strong and that we have the will and the determination to use our strength, even if it requires total war, they will never dare to predict that their conquest of the world is inevitable."

Noting that decisions which involve men and arms are "always difficult and full of dreadful results," Cardinal Cushing declared:
