### Doctors Told Federal Funds Needed

New York—(RNS)—Rep. John E. Fogarty (D-R.I.) told the National Federation of Catholic Physicians Guilds here that increased federal aid seems to be the answer in defraying the current high cost of medical and dental education.

Warning that America's future supply of doctors and dentists is being seriously threatened by the prohibitive cost of long years of schooling, the Congressmen urged that more scholarships be given to competent applicants and that federal funds be allocated to replace deteriorating buildings and equipment in medical and dental schools.

His remarks came in a keynote address here before the federation's Century Dinner marking the incorporation of the national group's 100th member guild in Rochester, Minn. The NCFPG was founded in 1932 by a group of Catholic doctors in Brooklyn, N.Y.

"Today in the U.S.," Rep. Fogarty said, "the choice of the medical profession as a career is largely conditioned by the applicant's financial background. The average annual tuition and maintenance cost... is keeping many hundreds of qualified young people out of the nation's medical and dental schools."

"The result," he added, "is a down-grading in the quality of graduates from such institutions in recent years."

Observing that the trend is towards stepped-up federal support to bolster state and local government aid to these professional schools, the Rhode Island Democrat noted that federal aid increased from a small seven per cent in the field of medical education and research in 1940 to about 53 per cent last year.

Rep. Fogarty said he failed to understand why the American Medical Association opposed federal financial aid in both education and research. "Far from discouraging private and local initiative," he stated, "the upsurge in federal support has encouraged greater efforts from these groups. During the past 20 years non-federal aid has risen from \$140 million to \$350 million. While aid was backed up in a welcome rate of federal support has outstripped local and private efforts, there has been a definite upward trend there also."

### Nuns' Prayers Taxed Don't Qualify As Charity

London—(RNS)—Orders of contemplative nuns, both Roman Catholic and Anglican, have been refused tax exemptions normally accorded religious and charitable organizations in a decision by the government here. According to the ruling, contemplative nuns do not qualify as charitable organizations since unlike "active" congregations, they do not teach, provide nursing service, or assist the poor. Opponents of the government's stand, noting that contemplative nuns spend their lives praying for mankind, say that a life of prayer contributes to the advancement of religion, sufficient ground for recognition as a charity. Affected in England are 60 Catholic convents, mostly Carmelite or Benedictine, and 12 Anglican convents.

### Davenport Diocese To Aid Mexico Village

Davenport—(NC)—Nestled high in the mountains east of Mexico City is Huayacocotla, a village in need of spiritual, economic and agricultural help. The Papal Volunteers for Latin America program of the Davenport diocese hopes to make that aid available. Father Louis M. Colonnese, diocesan Papal Volunteer representative, announced that the Diocese of Tulancingo, which includes Huayacocotla, will be the special area of concentration for the Davenport program.

HE ALSO announced that the first volunteer from the diocese, 23-year-old Hawaiian-born Laureta Andaya, will leave in late August for Huayacocotla. There she will lead a bookkeeping and secretarial skills necessary for the operation of a credit union and cooperative. Future volunteers will include a credit union advisor and an agricultural specialist trained to help the community back on its feet.

### U.S. Jesuits Plan Africa Mission

Washington—(NC)—Father Neil G. McCluskey, S.J., widely known educator and writer, will lead the first American Jesuit missionary effort in Africa.

Father McCluskey, dean of education at Gonzaga University, Spokane, Washington, and associate editor of *America* magazine, will leave in October for Lusaka, Northern Rhodesia, to establish an institute on social and economic studies at a university being opened by the government.

Father McCluskey, author of the book, "Catholic Viewpoint on Education," said during a visit here that the U.S. Jesuits will staff a minor seminary in Broken Hill, Northern Rhodesia, next year and also plan to send priests to a high school in the country.

### Encyclical Expected Soon

Vatican City—(RNS)—Pope John XXIII confirmed reports that he would soon issue an encyclical on social problems, and said it would provide the faithful with "rich food for their souls."

It had been rumored that the encyclical would be issued on the Feast of Sts. Peter and Paul (June 29), but the Pope said merely that it would be published "in the very near future."

The Pope made the announcement to thousands of worshippers after he celebrated a Mass in St. Peter's Basilica in commemoration of the feast.

He said the encyclical would be entitled, "Mater et Magistra" (Mother and Teacher), and translations were being prepared in many languages.

The Vatican Radio later reminded listeners that the encyclical would mark the 70th anniversary of Pope Leo XIII's celebrated encyclical, *Rerum Novarum* (On the Condition of the Working Classes), which it described as the Church's "basic document on social and industrial problems."

### Prisoners Confirmed

Chicago—(NC)—Eighty-five inmates of the Illinois State Prison at Stateville were confirmed by Bishop Martin D. McNamara of Joliet in the prison chapel.

Several prisoners who already have been confirmed acted as sponsors for the group, about half of whom are converts. This is the tenth year Bishop McNamara has confirmed at the institution.

### Smear Church, First Step In Communist Takeover

Bogota—(NC)—Colombia's leading newspaper has published a detailed story on what it says is the Soviet Communist party's final instruction for the conquest of Latin America.

El Tiempo in its front-page story (June 19) gave no indication as to how it acquired the document in question. It said the instructions promised that a veritable army of communist workers, experts and specialists would come to Latin America from this July to September at the invitation of local trade union and other groups. In addition to their work as communist agents, the document said, the visiting workers would be charged with selecting native candidates for visits to Russia and Czechoslovakia.

THE MAIN GOAL of the instructions, according to El Tiempo, is to discredit the Catholic Church and the clergy in particular.

It quotes the party directive as calling on agitators throughout Latin America to follow the Cuban example of "attacks against religion, particularly the Catholic religion, as the opium of the people."

The document published by the newspaper states that "the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics..."

Iovoda, of the Catholic University of America, columnist for the National Catholic Welfare Conference *Feature* Service.
