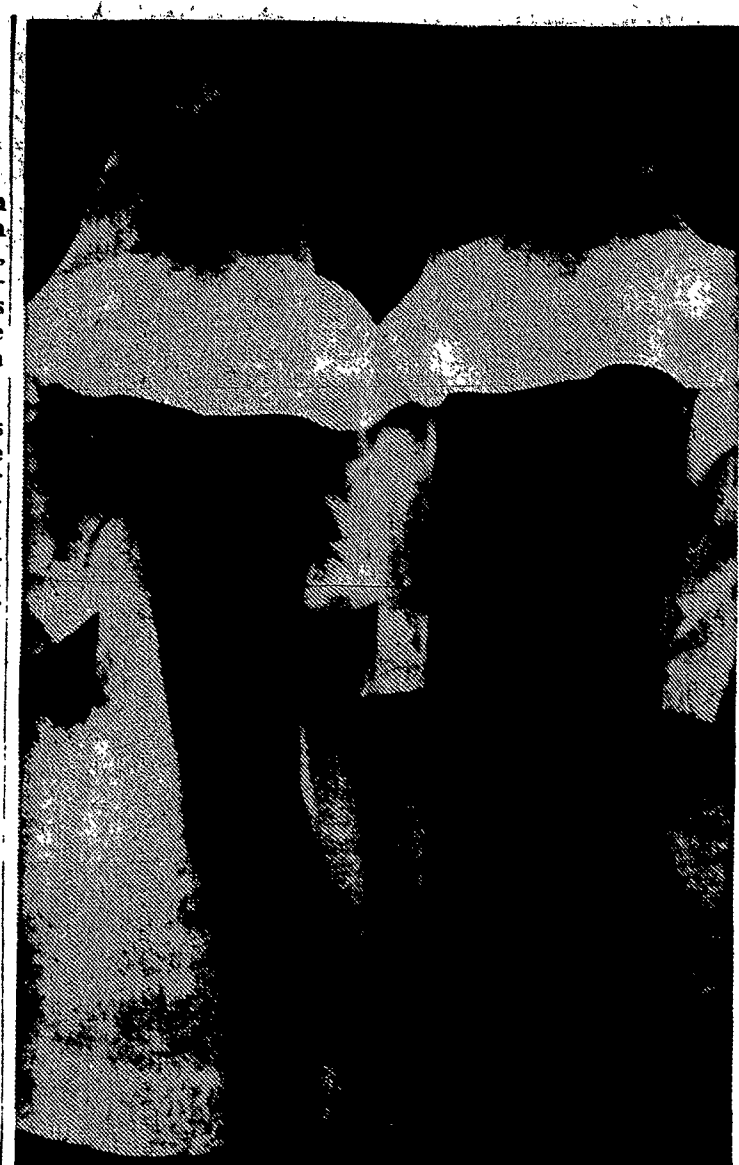

Theatre News

Stratford, Conn.

"AS YOU LIKE IT"—It's fresh and young and gay—commonplace adjectives, perhaps, but when combined they mean an enchanting production. From the moment Donald Harron as Orlando comes down stage to confide his troubles to the audience, they are ready to agree with Rosalind that he is an unusually nice young man and to enjoy the joke of his not recognizing Rosalind, dressed as a boy, when she and her cousin, Celia and his old servant, Adam, all meet again in the Forest of Arden.

That it is all in modern dress doesn't seem to make much difference, one way or the other. Orlando wears turquoise blue overalls which match his eyes. Miss Kim Hunter as Rosalind is first seen in a gay summer frock and really does look very different in her brown slacks and shirt and crimson cap. Celia wears a more demure but still smart cotton frock in the forest and makes a wonderful entrance there in a huge floppy hat, trailing white fox-embroidered with a dressing case, handbag and hat boxes.

THE SHEPHERDS and shepherdesses still wear the conventional stage costumes of their profession but the Good Duke appears in a white linen suit—was there a Forest Laundry? The excited courtiers have varying shades of slacks and sweaters.

Jacques is in black. He is Donald Davis (KRAPP'S LAST TAPE) and very good he is: a not too lean philosopher who enjoys his own pessimism, his chance meetings with strangers and the appreciative audience for his monologues he finds in the Duke's circle. As the Good Duke, Will Geer imparts an aura of kindness which overflows into the audience, and that too much villainy may not mar the genial course of the comedy, the Bad Duke is a roly-poly dictator, who jumps up and down in a temper just like Tweedledum. He is also given a thin, blonde female companion, not mentioned by Shakespeare. We wonder did she also share the Bad Duke's conversion?

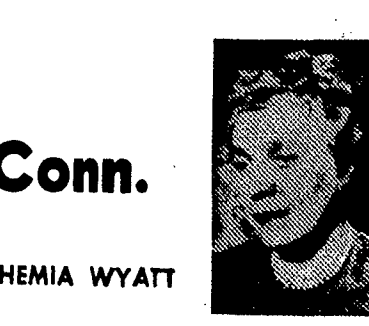
Miss Hunter's Rosalind is a graceful youth, nimble of feet and of wit which has a slight sting to it. She will keep Orlando on his toes as his wife, Carrie Nye as Celia has a distinctive Junior League aroma and shows her charmingly feminine foresightedness when she touches up her make-up by the brook just before the appearance of Oliver whom she instantly chooses for her hero.

HIRAM SHERMAN brings all his humor and charm to Touchstone. He wears motley but of modern cut and while the Good Duke's followers carry bows and arrows, the parson enters perilously on a bicycle!

AS YOU LIKE IT has the same basic background as MACBETH but flooded with green light while a leafy forest drops down from Arden where a strip of blue silk and a footbridge create a brook. With an accompaniment of songs rightly sung by Sam Greene and music by David Anram, the young director, Word Baker, has given the comedy its proper and quickening lightheartedness.

MACBETH—it was a misty evening in the Highlands when the three witches met; their figures a peering fitfully through the fog to Macbeth and Banquo. This MACBETH is Scottish to the core in an archaic Scotland where the castle is wooden and hung with skins. King Duncan wears the hide of a white bear and his chieftains carry spears but their kilts are of somber hue and their plaids even gloomier.

One innovation is that Macbeth has a distinctly Southern intonation. He is Pat Hingle who won stage awards for his playing in J.B. etc. but the Actors Studio is not the best training for Shakespeare. His Macbeth is the more lamentable because it defies all rules of rhetoric. Here and there, words are shouted for emphasis, a whining melancholy gives place to sporadic violence and his greatest speech, "Tomorrow



Academy Elects Cardinal

Paris — (RNS) — Eugene Cardinal Tisserant, dean of the Sacred College in Rome, was elected here to a seat on the French Academy left vacant by the death of Duc Maurice de Broglie, a nuclear physicist.

Cardinal Tisserant, a patriarchal figure with a long, grey-flecked beard, is a man of vast erudition and one of the world's leading Orientalists. He speaks Arabic, Russian and eight Oriental languages. Until 1959, the cardinal held the offices of secretary of the Sacred Congregation for the Oriental Church and Librarian and Archivist of the Catholic Church. Today he holds the latter post only.

Cardinal Tisserant's election brought to 38 the number of the "immortals," as the academicians are called. Since the death of Georges Cardinal Grégoire, Bishop of Le Mans, in 1959, there had been no cardinal among the members of the French Academy. One of the "immortals," Marcel Achard commented after Cardinal Tisserant's election: "We must have a cardinal's robe among our number. Cardinal Tisserant is a great man."

Richard Waring was valuable as MacDuff, even more so was James Ray as the young prince Malcolm. Hiram Sherman won the one laugh in the tragedy as the Porter. In the final battle, a hardy Highlander scaled the battlements of Macbeth's castle with a flying leap while another leapt down. Macbeth's last fight was with broadsword and round shields. Din and fury was the keynote.
