

Washington — (RNS) — Weapons and uniforms of the past draw smiles here as Providence Hospital, operated by the Sisters of Charity of Nazareth, marked its 100th anniversary in the nation's capital. Msgr. Patrick A. Ryan and Sister Eleanor, director of the hospital, inspect the Union Army uniform worn by Charles G. Hammond of the Sharpsburg (Md.) Rifles, a Civil War commemorating organization, and the 1861 costume of Miss Maureen Crittenden, hospital nurses aide. Providence Hospital had only opened its doors a century ago when it was literally overrun by a great number of Union casualties. It was cited by the Lincoln administration for "heroic service to the wounded."
