New Rector Appointed To Head LeMoynes

The Very Rev. James J. Shanahan, S.J., Provincial of the Buffalo Province of the Society of Jesus today announced the appointment of the Rev. Nicholas J. Sullivan, S.J., as President and Rector of LeMoynes College, Buffalo, succeeding Rev. Robert F. Grewen, S.J., President of LeMoynes since 1954.

FATHER GREWEN leaves LeMoynes to join the faculty of Bellarmine College, Plattsburgh, N.Y., where he will act as Spiritual Director of the Jesuit Seminary and devote himself to the work of Retreat Master and writer.

Father Sullivan, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Nicholas Sullivan of Pittsford, Mass., comes to LeMoynes from Canisius College, Buffalo, where he was a member of the Department of History and Assistant Professor of History.

In addition to academic degrees of M.A. and Ph.D. in History from Fordham University, Father Sullivan also holds two ecclesiastical degrees: the Licentiate in Philosophy (Ph.L.) from West Baden College and the Licentiate in Theology (S.T.L.) from Woodstock College.

New Principal At Mt. Carmel

Father Bartholomew Parsons, O.Carm., has been chosen as new principal of Mount Carmel High School, Auburn, and Prior of the Auburn Carmelites. He has held the position of Director of Studies.

HE SUCCEEDS Father Brendan Hourihan, the school's first principal. Father Hourihan was selected last week as 'consultant' of the Province of Saint Elias and Novice Master of the Carmelite Novitiate in Williams-town, Mass. Appointments were made by the Provincial Chapter of Carmelites held in Middletown.

Before his assignment as principal, Father Hourihan supervised the construction of the new Auburn school and later was responsible for the addition of a new wing.

In his new duties Father Hourihan will give special training in the religious life to young men aspiring to the Carmelite Priesthood.

Southern California were interrupted in 1956 when he was transferred to Auburn to assume the post of Director of Studies at the new Mount Carmel High School.

After three years of service in the Army Father Bonaventure entered the Trappist monastery at Piffard in 1953 where he was solemnly professed in 1958.

The attendance is great, too; 1,200 and more are frequently on hand.

They stay on even for the "Late, late show", just as long as Father Erb cares to keep it going with his portable electric generator and his entertaining and instructive remarks. It gives him a wonderful opportunity to speak to the people.

Named after its benefactor, Pope John's Mobile Cinema was thought up fast by Father Erb when granted an audience by the Holy Father shortly before leaving for Yendi.

Somebody sent Pope John a check of about \$800 for a car for a poor missionary. Father Erb relates that he happened

to be in the right office in Rome when that check came in, and, of course, he qualified on both counts.

Then and there Pope John's Mobile Cinema sprang into reality. With an electric generator, projector and many reels of movie film, the new Volkswagen van was on board ship during the film about the Resurrection", he said.

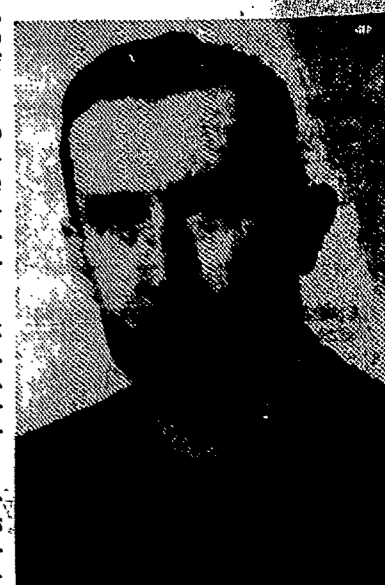


New Car Given To Sisters

Rochesterian Jesuit Named College Prexy

The Rev. Francis V. Courneen, S.J., has been appointed Rector and President of Bellarmine College, Plattsburgh, according to an announcement from the Very Rev. James J. Shanahan, S.J., Provincial of the Buffalo Province of the Society of Jesus.

Father Courneen comes to Bellarmine College from Canisius College, Buffalo, where he was a member of the Department of Philosophy and Assistant Professor of Social Philosophy and Logic.

(He is the son of Mrs. Frank Courneen and the late Mr. Courneen of Thurston Rd. A brother, Rev. James P. Courneen, is a Maryknoll father, stationed in Bolivia.)

THE FORMER Canisius College professor, whose home is in St. Augustine's parish, Rochester, thus becomes the religious supervisor of the Novitiate and Juniors of the Buffalo Province of the Society of Jesus, succeeding the Reverend William J. Gleason, S.J., who has been appointed chaplain of Kenmore Mercy Hospital, Kenmore, N.Y.

A native of Syracuse, N.Y., Father Courneen lived in various cities of upstate New York and New York City, graduating from Regis High School, New York City in 1932. He entered the Society of Jesus in 1932 at St. Andrews-on-Hudson, Poughkeepsie, N.Y. for Novitiate and Juniors studies.

In 1936 he entered Weston College, Weston, Mass., for three years of Philosophical studies. He attended the Jesuit College of Theological Studies at Woodstock College, Woodstock, Md. from 1942-1946 where he was ordained to the priesthood in 1945.

FATHER COURNEEN has received the academic degrees of A.B. and M.A. in Philosophy

from Boston College; the M.A. in Classics from Fordham University; the ecclesiastical degree of Ph.L. (Licentiate in Philosophy) from Weston College and S.T.L. (Licentiate in Theology) from Woodstock College. Prior to his appointment to Canisius College in 1960, Father taught in the Department of Philosophy at St. Peter's College, Jersey City, N.J. (1947-1950) and at Fordham University (1950-1960).

Father Courneen is currently a member of the American Forensic Association, New York State Speech Association and the Jesuit Philosophical Association. On special assignments, he has acted as Special Assistant of the Catholic Charities of New York Archdiocese (1952-1960); Director of Spiritual Formation Program, Sisters of Mercy of the Union (1955-1959); Director of Forensic Program, Fordham University (1950-1960); Secretary-Treasurer of Eastern Forensic Association (1953-1954).
