

## Priests Killed On Thruway, Requiem Held

Cleveland — Archbishop Edward F. Hoban of Cleveland offered Solemn Requiem Masses in their respective churches Friday and Saturday for the two priests killed in a New York Thruway accident near Clarence, N. Y. last week.

Victims in the worst traffic tragedy ever to involve diocesan priests of Cleveland were the Rev. Stanley A. Mroczka, 47, assistant at St. Charles Borromeo Church and the Rev. Casimir J. Sitko, 46, assistant at Transfiguration.

They were fatally injured shortly after noon Monday of last week when the car in which they were riding veered off the Thruway near Clarence and overturned in a field.

The Rev. Philip Schwier, pastor of Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary Parish in nearby Harris Hill, anointed them at the scene.

Father Mroczka died soon after the accident and Father Sitko died on Tuesday in St. Jerome's hospital.
