Ministers On Retreat

Covington — (NC) — Bishop John J. Wright of Pittsburgh will conduct a retreat for Protestant clergymen of Kentucky September 12 to 14 at the Marydale Retreat House here.

Father Thomas F. Middelndorf, executive secretary of the National Catholic Retreat Conference, said the retreat was planned because of interest expressed by several Protestant clergymen in the Catholic retreat movement.

Bishop Richard H. Ackerman, C.S.Sp., of Covington has authorized the use of diocesan retreat facilities for the special retreat. Bishop Wright is episcopal adviser of the retreat movement in the U.S.

India Jesuit Chief Botanist

Calcutta — (RNS) — A Jesuit priest has been appointed chief botanist to the Botanical Survey of India. Father H. Santapau, 57, was selected by the government's Union Public Service Commission after it had interviewed a number of candidates.

For 20 years, Father Santapau has been head of the Biology Section and Botany Department of St. Xavier's College, Bombay. A frequent lecturer on plant life in India, he has written much on the subject and a series of his articles, "Know Your Trees," has been issued in book form.



Priest Braves Flames

Denver — (RNS) — Amid smoke and flame that engulfed a crashed jet airliner can be seen a Roman Catholic priest who was among the first to reach the fiery plane that carried 17 passengers to their deaths here. Photo indicates the Denver priest, unidentified amid the confusion of rescue operations, had gone as close to the wreckage as he could in an effort to aid passengers. Priests at the Denver airport and at four hospitals administered the last rites to the dead and dying and brought comfort to 55 persons who were injured or burned in the crash. Giant jet carried 122 persons, including a crew of seven.

Families Rent Camp For Summer Vacation

Los Angeles — (NC) — Talk about "cheaper by the dozen." Well, it's been established here that one way to beat the high cost of a family vacation is simply to gather enough friends and rent an entire camp out right.

Sixteen families with a total of 80 children tried it and found the cost averaged \$90 per family for a week in the mountains — complete with cabins and recreation.

The 16 families rented Camp Glen near San Diego. Dormitory cabins, one to a family, were \$180 each. There were enough bunk beds for even the largest brood.
