The Premise

THE PREMISE—Downstairs at Thompson and Bleecker Streets in the Village there is a small theatre in the round or as it is called a "Theatre Cafe" which offers a new type of entertainment. In a way it's a return to the old Commedia del Arte of the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries when the actors all improvised their lines.

Given the ghost of an idea, the four actors in the company of **THE PREMISE**—a girl and three men—can whip any strange suggestion into instantaneous shape and add to it some substance and a finish. Their equipment is in their brains.

Behind them are six or seven swing doors in various bright colors. Beside them on the stage are as many square boxes which fit over each other and which constitute all their props.

Then let the audience offer a line and a place—indoor or outdoor—and presto! a skit is staged which almost invariably has a climax and a point and the smart part of it is that they know when to stop! Adroitly they can change a suggestion from the audience which seems out of line; even more adroitly can each one of them follow up a lead given by another.

The second half of the program is devoted to politics and comments on events of the day. Further suggestions from the audience are written down and then, after an intermission for coffee, terse commentaries are offered on the various topics in rapid fire succession, the company rushing in and out of all the doors.

The result is a sparkling series of political cartoons, acted out instead of inked. For instance: A native is laboriously planting rice. Comes the Russian who says he will show the poor fool how a tractor can clear all the water from his paddy fields. "No, No," cries the native.

Banjo Playing Priest Comments On Teenagers

Between takes at a recent recording session for Riverside Records, the Rev. Joseph Dustin, C.S.S.R., of Detroit's Holy Redeemer Church, lamented to a group of interested listeners that today's teen agers have little or no interest in doing creative things. According to the priest, who has been finding relaxation and enjoyment at his hobby—playing jazz banjo—for two decades, "Our young people would rather receive than give, even to the point of paying a price."

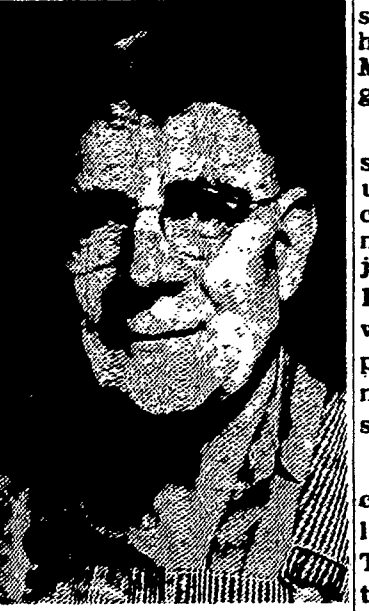


"Everything is a 'package deal,' made available to them at the flick of a switch or the twist of a dial and they have no desire to cultivate any talents they might have. There is very little entertainment within the family group today. The family orchestra, the quartette, the song-fest around the piano are things of the past."

WHEN YOUNG Joseph Dustin was growing up in St. Louis during the late twenties and early thirties, this was not the case in the Dustin household. There was much music with the entire family participating in the regular gatherings and songs arranged by his mother, Mary Alice.

An accomplished musician, Mrs. Dustin doubled after her household chores between duties as a church organist, choir director, and leader of a spirited 15-piece jazz band. His father, Edward, a former vaudeville performer and songwriter, who had abandoned the road in favor of a position with Pathe Films, also encouraged his youngsters toward creative activity and Father Dustin now reflects that these early musicals, which were the basis for his present sideline and hobby as a banjoist, played an important part in his healthy emotional development.
