Sister Grace Regina, Noted Educator Dies

Sister Grace Regina Jennings, director of guidance at Nazareth Academy, died July 31, 1961 in St. Joseph's Hospital, Elmira, after a 4-month illness.

Sister Grace Regina was taken ill shortly after she received a summer study grant from the Society for French-American Cultural Services and Education Aid. The illness prevented her from taking a long anticipated trip to France.

SHE HAD RECEIVED a master's degree in French from the University of Montreal in 1941 and for many years was chairman of the French department at Nazareth.

She did graduate study in guidance at the Catholic University of America and completed her requirement for a New York State permanent certification in guidance at the University of Rochester.

She was counselor to Nazareth Academy students from 1928 and director of guidance when she was taken ill. During the summer of 1960 she was invited to membership in the National Defense Education Act Guidance Institute and worked closely with Dr. Harold L. Munson of the University of Rochester on the newly-formed executive council of the Genesee Valley Personnel and Guidance Association. She later was elected secretary of the council.

Sister Grace Regina was a native of Geneva and joined the Sisters of St. Joseph's order in 1923. She attended D'Youville College in Buffalo and faculty a year after her graduation.

SHE WAS a member of the New York Association of Teachers of Foreign Languages, the New York Counselors Association, the New York Association of Deans and Counselors and the American Personnel and Guidance Association.

She leaves three sisters, the Misses Mildred and Pauline Jennings of Geneva and Mrs. Joseph Crawley of Miami, Fla., and two brothers, Donald Jennings of Geneva and Joseph Jennings of Washington, D.C.

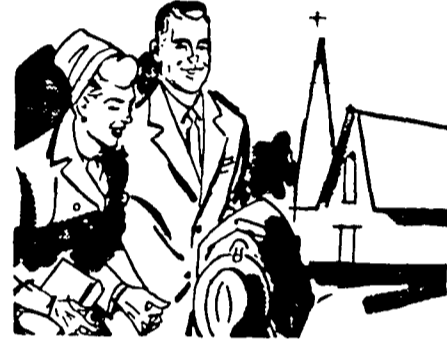
