

## Little Holland's Big Heart Gives Third of Clergy To Foreign Missions

Utrecht—(RNS)—A regrouping of priests in Holland to make more of them available for work outside the country was urged by Bernard Cardinal Alfrink, Archbishop of Utrecht, as a means to help the clergy shortage in many parts of the world.

At the same time he noted a falling-off in religious vocations in Holland and said this must be met by fostering a higher concept of the priestly life and more intensive cultivation of religious vocations among young people.

The cardinal's remarks were made during a press conference on the occasion of the opening of a new inter-diocesan seminary for late vocations at Horst, in the Dutch Province of Limburg. The seminary also enrolls students preparing for ordination in various religious orders.

Noting that about a third of Holland's priests are put at the disposal of the world Church, Cardinal Alfrink said that "this great missionary task of the Dutch clergy will necessarily be hindered by a decline in vocations."

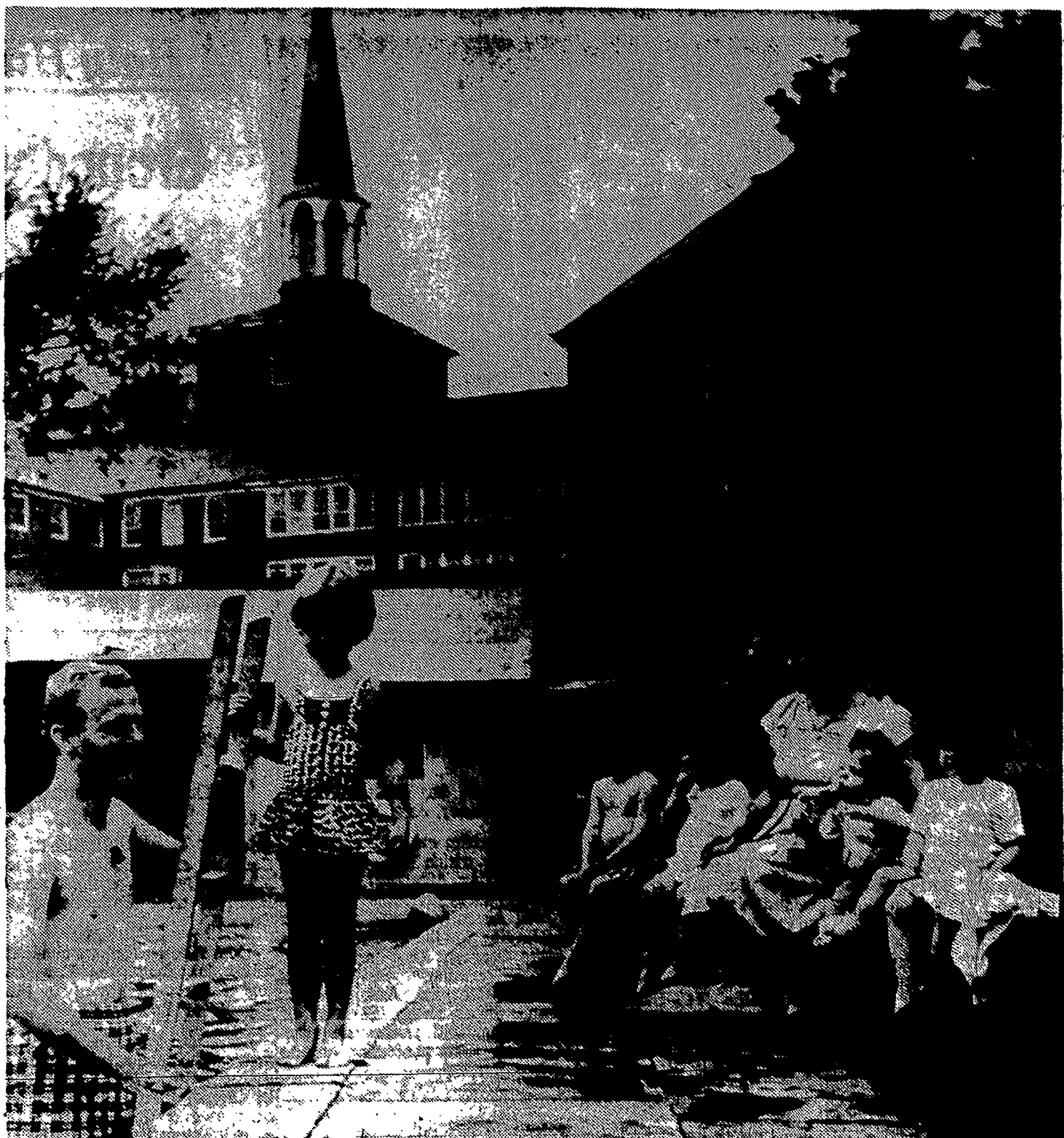
"Therefore," he said, "we should try to make more priests available for work outside the country by a process of regrouping priests in the ministry at home. For this an open and frank discussion will be necessary."

Cardinal Alfrink quoted statistics which showed there were 13,500 Dutch priests on Jan. 1, 1957. On the basis of a Catholic population of 4,500,000, this meant one priest for every 320 Dutch Catholics, or one for every 160 male Catholics.

"If one may assume," he said, "that the male population above and under 25 is about equally divided, these figures mean that there is one priest for every 80 male Catholics above 25. Considering these figures, it must be called regrettable, but not yet alarming, that the number of ordinations have fallen by 100 a year."

Nevertheless, the cardinal stressed, the decline in vocations "does seriously affect the world Church, because of the 13,500 priests, about 4,500 work outside Holland."

Speaking of the need to create a "higher estimation of the priesthood," Cardinal Alfrink said that "owing to one-sided criticism of the priestly life and the training for the priesthood, people often lack a proper appreciation of the priestly state."

### Tax Bias Aids Tyranny

Rio De Janeiro — (NC) — So-called liberals who press for state monopoly in education to give their children... THE GOVERNOR, whose state includes the metropolis of Rio de Janeiro, spoke before a conference which brought together educators from 29 countries on five continents. Held at the Catholic University here, the congress opening session was presided over by Jaime Cardinal de Barros Camara, Archbishop of Rio. Father Edward B. Rooney, S.J., of New York, president of the Jesuit Educational Association, served as delegate both of his own organization and of the U.S. National Catholic Educational Association. Americo Jacobina Lacombe, chairman of the executive committee of the congress, in his opening speech said the concept of democracy held by the international union is that of a "political regime that extends to the weakest and humblest the just distribution of the material and spiritual means which liberal capitalism reserves to the rich and powerful, and which communism denies to everyone."

## Guidance Needed In Integration

Cleveland — (NC) — A housing official suggested here that diocesan task forces be established to help prevent panic selling of homes in racially changing neighborhoods.

Dennis Clark, supervisor of the Human Relations Commission of the Philadelphia Housing Division, proposed that such task forces be directed by professional social workers who would move and work among people in changing neighborhoods.

He told the First Friday club, "Most of the time a person will sell his home because he is afraid his neighbor will sell first, or that he'll be the last white family on the block, or that his property will be devalued."

"But the truth is, nobody wants to sell," he said. "Each person's home represents an investment, and more important, in memories. A professional social worker, by getting the people together, could help eliminate the distrust among neighbors and prevent panic selling."
