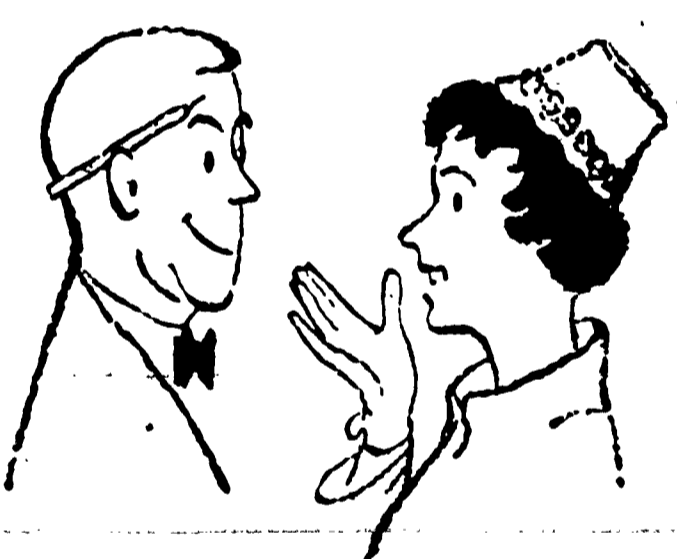
**R. McMahon's Rites Held**
