Common Prayer

Melbourne — (RNS) — A significant development in improved relations between Christian Churches was seen here in the approval of Protestant, Catholic and Orthodox leaders of a prayer form for use at interreligious gatherings.

Compiled by the Victorian Inter-Church Industry Committee, an organization concerned with the application of religious principles to the industrial world, the approved common form consists of two general prayers and the Lord's Prayer.

Its use was authorized by Catholic and Orthodox leaders as well as eight member bodies of the Victorian Council of Churches: Anglican, Baptist, Churches of Christ, Congregational, Methodist, Presbyterian, Salvation Army and Society of Friends.
