John V. Harding Rites Conducted in Elmira

Funeral Mass for John V. Harding, brother of the Rev. Francis Harding, pastor of Holy Cross Church, Ovid and Sacred Heart Church, Romulus was offered in St. Patrick's Church, Elmira on Tuesday, Aug. 22.

Mr. Harding, 57, of Residence 3, Elmira Reformatory died Saturday, Aug. 19, 1961. He was assistant superintendent of the Elmira Reformatory. Under treatment for some time for a heart ailment, he had, however, worked as usual Friday and expired unexpectedly on the Reformatory grounds.

CELEBRANT OF Solemn Requiem Mass was Father James Collins, Reformatory Chaplain. Rev. John S. Hayes was deacon. Rev. Michael C. Hogan, sub-deacon and Rev. Jerome Schifferl, master of ceremonies. Rt. Rev. Msgr. Francis J.

He began his state service as a guard at Auburn Prison, July 3, 1929. In the same year he was transferred to Dannemora. He was promoted to sergeant at Dannemora in 1934 and to captain in 1938. In 1944, Mr. Harding returned to Auburn Prison as assistant principal keeper and was promoted to principal keeper in 1946. He went to the Reformatory as assistant superintendent, Oct. 1, 1949.

He left Elmira in July, 1955 to become superintendent of the Napanoch Institution for Male Defective Delinquents. He remained there until October, 1956 when he returned to Elmira to resume the assistant superintendent's post.

Mr. Harding was a member of the board of directors of Elmira Catholic Family Service, headed Community Chest drives at the Reformatory and served on the advisory board of the Community Education Department of Elmira College.

He was a member of St. Patrick's Holy Name Society and of Elmira Elks Lodge.

Surviving are his wife, Gertrude Harding; one son, John V. Harding, Jr., of Elmira; a daughter, Mrs. Robert (Susanne) Gamar of Elmira; a grandchild, Christopher Harding; his brother, Father Harding, who is a patient at St. Joseph's Hospital and was unable to attend the funeral services; and one sister, Mrs. Mary Hoisey of Ovid and several nieces and nephews.

Burial was in St. Peter and Paul's Cemetery, Elmira, where the final blessing was given by Monsignor Lane assisted by the Rev. Fathers Francis Turner, John Lynch, James Collins and Michael Hogan. Guards from the Reformatory acted as guard of honor.

Requiem Offered For Father Of Two Nuns

Funeral Mass for Thomas J. Norman, 98, a charter member of Blessed Sacrament Church and father of two Sisters of St. Joseph was offered in Blessed Sacrament Church, Friday, Aug. 18.

Mr. Norman, last surviving charter member of Rochester Musician's Union died Aug. 15, 1961 in St. Ann's Home.

The Rt. Rev. Msgr. Thomas F. Connors celebrated the Requiem Mass with the Reverend Fathers James Slattery, Donald Mulcahy and Jeremiah Murphy present in the Sanctuary.

A native of Colchester, England, Mr. Norman learned to play the bass horn while in the British army. In 1882, he married Margaret Luddy near Dublin, Ireland. He and his wife came here a few years later and lived for many years at 625 Linden St.

Mr. Norman was a painting and wallpaper contractor in his early years, but most of his life was spent as a musician. He played the bass viol and tuba in the 54th Regiment Band, Hebing's Band, Genesee Falls Band, the Park Band under the late Theodore Dossenbach, and in orchestras led by Theodore's brother, the late Herman Dossenbach.

Mr. Norman played at numerous affairs in the city and at the Cook Opera House, the Lyceum and Victoria theaters.
