

Father Gugel's Mission Opens

The Colerain, Ohio mission church of Mother Frances Cabrini will be dedicated six miles northwest of Bridgeport, by Bishop John King Musso of Steubenville on Sunday, Sept. 10. Father Ramon Gugel, a native of Rochester, heads the local mission house in charge of the new church.

A Solemn Pontifical Mass will be celebrated by Bishop Musso following the dedicatory ceremonies scheduled for 5 p.m.

First Mass at the church named for St. Frances Xavier Cabrini, first citizen of the United States to be canonized by the church was offered Dec. 22, 1960 and Father Gugel and his assistant Father George Shipman, moved in four weeks later.

Bishop Imparts Blessing At J. F. Noonan Mass

Funeral services for John F. Noonan, prominent attorney and distinguished civic leader were conducted at Holy Rosary Church, Monday, August 28. Mr. Noonan, 54, of 663 Seneca Parkway died unexpectedly at his home after a brief illness on August 24, 1961.

THE PURPOSE of the drive will be to increase the incomes so that the church debt can be eliminated and money set aside for necessary repairs to the convent at St. Aloysius and the eventual erection of a new church.

Bishop Kearney imparted the final absolution at the Solemn Requiem Mass. Celebrant of the Mass was the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Charles F. Shay; the Rev. James F. Doyle was deacon, and Rev. James Cosgrove, subdeacon. Auxiliary Bishop Casey was present in the Sanctuary with the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Dennis W. Hickey, the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Richard K. Burns, Very Rev. Msgr. Edward J. McAniff. Other priests attending were Reverend Fathers Paul G. Wohlrab, Walter Cushing, Edward Lintz, James Maxvin, and Gerard Murphy.

The campaign will be a house to house solicitation of the two parishes by volunteer workers from both parishes.

Mr. Noonan was a life long resident of the 10th Ward and parishioner of Holy Rosary Church. He was educated at Holy Rosary School, Aquinas Institute, St. Bonaventure College and Georgetown University Law School.

After two training meetings the men will start their calls after the Solemn Opening Services presided over by Reverend Francis E. Hester of St. John's, Spencerport, an alumnus of St. Aloysius School, who will represent Bishop Casey.

Among organizations he was a member of are the Knights of Columbus, Georgetown Club of Rochester, St. Bonaventure Club of Rochester, and the Daily Mass League.

The campaign will conclude September 22.
