Nazareth College will offer courses for public and parochial elementary school teachers this year in Saturday afternoon sessions.

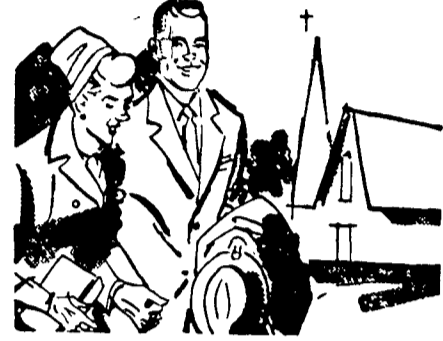
Courses will be offered in mathematics, science, introduction to philosophy, ontology and English literature.
