# 1,400 To Attend Teachers' Meet

Fourteen hundred teachers from more than 100 schools in the Diocese will attend two day sessions at Rochester's Community War Memorial Monday and Tuesday, Sept. 18 and 19.

The 57th annual teachers' conference will hear Ogdensburg's Bishop James J. Navagh give the keynote address on "Catholic Schools and the Church-State Problem."

Other speakers include noted educators who will explain latest methods and aids in teaching.

Bishop Kearney will give the closing address Tuesday afternoon.

More than 130 exhibits will display new textbooks, supplies and teaching equipment.

Father William Roche and Father Daniel Brent of the diocesan schools office are in charge of the program.

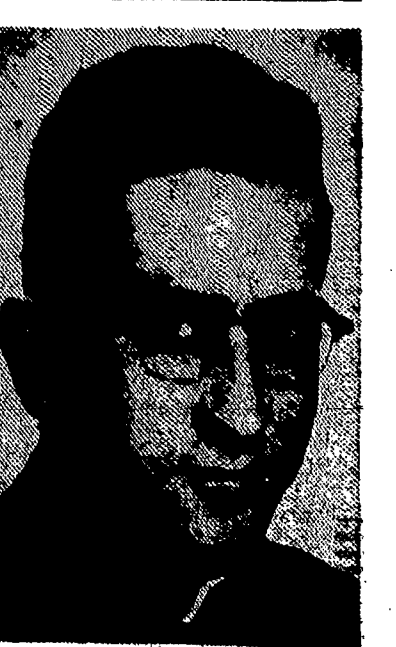
## Ground Broken For New Chapel
