## OSY Deanery Women Hear State Assemblyman

Geneva—"Government is your business . . . and the success of your business lies in your year-round concern and cooperation." Assemblyman Robert Quigley told members of the Ontario-Seneca-Yates Deanery, National Council of Catholic Women, at the First Saturday luncheon in the Armitage in Seneca Falls.

One hundred and eighteen members of the tri-county area attended the Mass and luncheon Saturday, Sept. 2.

"THE DUTIES OF the electorate are three-fold," Quigley explained. "First there is the duty of all eligible voters to be registered and to have a voice in the selection of candidates through active participation in the primaries. Second, once having supported the selection of candidates be sure to vote and work for the election of the candidates in every way possible in your community. Third, and most important, once you have elected them and sent them to represent you, be sure they know your viewpoints on all matters up for legislative consideration."

Quigley then gave a brief description of the structure of the two legislative bodies, the Senate and the assembly of New York State. He stated that success of the legislation results from a very well organized committee system which now contains 37 separate committees who consider and work on all proposals before they take the form of bills to be acted upon.

The legislature meets for consideration of laws to be passed during the months of January, February, and March. During the other nine months they study and make preparation for framing of bills to be acted upon. Therefore, he said, it is very important that the voters spend those nine months in man Quigley.


