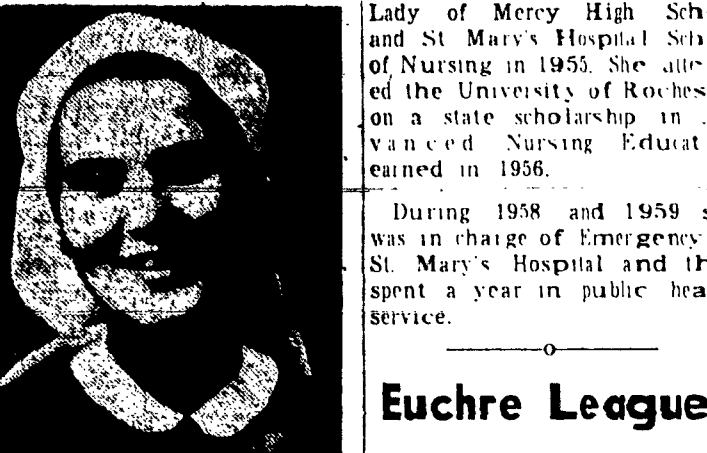
The marriage vows were received by the Rev. Leo J. Matuszewski, who performed the double ring ceremony.

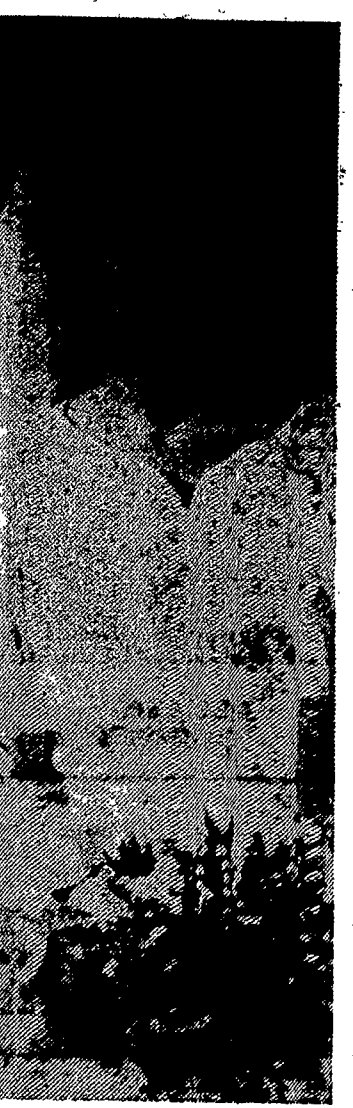
