Conesus — Brother Rodriguez James McParland, S.V.D., recently appointed to the Divine Word Mission in Ghana, West Africa, will be presented with the mission cross at a solemn departure ceremony set for Sunday, Oct. 1, 4 p.m., at the Divine Word Seminary, Conesus.

PRESENTATION will be made by the Very Rev. Leo F. Hotse, S.V.D., Provincial, followed immediately by a reception for the departing missionary brother.

Brother Rodriguez, S.V.D., plans to leave for Ghana early in October to take up his assignment at Adoagiri-Nsawam, location of the Divine Word Missionaries' training center for Brothers, as Prefect of Candidates. He has held a similar position at Conesus for the past three years. As a Brother in a world-wide mission society, he will be instructing young Ghanians to do their part as missionary Brothers, a truly Catholic "Peace Corps" effort.

During the past few weeks Brother Rodriguez, S.V.D., has been visiting at home. One of eight children of Mr. and Mrs. Robert J. McParland of Brooklyn, he joined the Divine Word Missionaries in 1953 at Conesus. He graduated from the Brother Candidates School June, 1955.

Following two years of Novitiate he pronounced his first vows as a Divine Word Missionary in 1957.
